

#### Sacred Music

For most of us, we listen to music. Hopefully we find it enjoyable. There is a beauty in music that touches our hearts and can even touch the soul that cannot be explained. God has been good enough to give us music that we may enjoy, but also to give praise to Him. At the basilica of St. Francis, you can pray in silence or you can sing a song in prayer to God.

This is what we do in Mass. St. Augustine has been quoted in saying: "One who sings well prays twice." Mother church has always understood the value of singing at Mass. Many of you may not know that the whole Mass is to be sung. I was blessed to be able to hear the Gospel on Good Friday chanted. It was amazing.

With music that is played at Mass, there has been a battle with the incorporation of secular music within the liturgy. St. Pius X and even as far back at the Council of Trent, had to deal with the music for the liturgy. It is not that the music was bad or evil. The music was good but when the people were coming to church, were they coming to praise God or to sit and listen to the performance? Were they coming to be entertained? As I mentioned St. Pius X, he dealt with the music of opera. That style of sing was being done during the Masses. It is not to say opera is bad. Opera is good, but is it proper for act of worship? Through the wisdom of St. Pius X, he states that the music at Holy Mass is to be sacred, in his writing of Tra le sollecitudini (1903). Vatican II reaffirmed this in the document Sacrosanctum Concilium (1968) and St. John Paul II re-affirmed it in the writing Chirograph on the Centenary of Tra le sollecitudini (2003). It is sacred music that mother Church desires, is how we worship within the sacred liturgy of the Mass.

There are three criteria for Sacred Music. It has to be holy, artistic, and universal. Holy and not secular, true art and not one's own interpretation, and universal and not one's own style. The reason for changing the Missals is because of this point. Some of the songs were contemporary and not sacred music. It is not to say the music is bad but it did not meet all three points. Those songs could be sung at a different time and place, but not for liturgical worship. Christian rock is good but not for the Mass. This is why the church holds Gregorian chant and polyphony as the highest for worship because it fit the three criteria to be sacred music. It follows what Mother Church has been telling all along. This was the reason for the New Missal, so we had the right music to worship before God. For it is not what music I like but what is proper to the actions of worship before God. I like the song "Spirit in the Sky" by Norman Greenbaum, I would not have that as music for a Mass, because it is secular and not universal. I give it being artistic but you need it to be holy and universal. There are many songs that sound good and inspire us but doesn't equate to sacred Music.

I will be put some music on our parish website so you know what Gregorian chant is and also polyphony.
