I am the bread of life!

In the gospels for the last few weeks, we have been traveling with Jesus, sharing some meals, and talking a lot about bread.

We start with Elijah ready to give up and die but is given bread for the journey. The bread sustains him for a forty-day journey. He did not stop believing, and God provided and prepared him for the trip. Elijah tasted and saw the goodness of the Lord

The second reading seems out of place with no mention of bread until you link the complaining of the Jews to the Ephesians letter. If we believe in the One sent from the Father and eat of this bread, we are sealed for the day of redemption and must remove all malice, anger, fury and reviling from ourselves. We must be imitators of God, loving all, welcoming all, willing to give of ourselves for others, even those who hurt and harm us.

We all know the importance of bread in our everyday life. It takes many forms like hamburger buns, English muffins, tortillas, and crackers. This bread helps us through the day, but the bread we really need to help us through this life and the next was provided by the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross. Jesus tells us whoever believes has eternal life.

I challenge you to show you believe this week by following the teachings from the Letter to the Ephesians:

"All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice.

And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ.

So be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and handed himself over for us as a sacrificial offering to God for a fragrant aroma."

Coverings

Face We are following CDC guidelines. If you are fully vaccinated (you've received all doses and at least two weeks have passed since your last dose), you do not need to wear a mask. Please wear a mask if you are not fully vaccinated or do not feel comfortable going mask-less.


