

Happy Epiphany! Epiphany is from the Greek *epiphaneia* which means "appearance" or "manifestation." Today we celebrate God's gift of the Christ to all in Jesus of Nazareth. It's a spectacular day with kings and presents and the original GPS – a star!

Global positioning systems (GPS) have transformed the way many of us navigate. No more maps or stopping at the gas station for directions (unless you are my Dad who would never do that!). The Magi used the original GPS – God's star that lead them to the Christ child. The prophet Isaiah tells us light is shining in the darkness of the world – both the star and the Savior. Regardless of being lost or being in the dark, the radiance of God permeates all corners of the world and today that star shines on who we know as the Light of the World.

Imagine what it must have been like for the Magi to follow that star! It is said they came from the East bringing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. They seem to have been profoundly affected by their encounter with Jesus because the defied the order of King Herod to report back to him regarding what they had seen.

I think the Magi set a good example for us listen to what God has planned for our lives in this world. Despite our best-laid plans, God always has something better in store for us. Perhaps this would be a great year to try something new in our parish like enhancing your prayer life, become involved in one of the liturgical ministries, join a small faith-sharing group, or start a book discussion group. Follow that bright light God is providing for you as you begin this New Year!


