Taste and see the goodness of the Lord!

We start off ordinary time with a tale we have heard many times and that is a foreshadow of the Eucharistic feast Jesus will proclaim at the Last Supper, the wedding at Cana. Here Jesus turns water into wine and hear the headwaiter say, "You have kept the good wine until now." Jesus is acting as a groom by providing wine for those at Cana and us today. This is how is starts his public ministry according to John.

It is also interesting to note who knew what happened to the wine. Just like at his birth, the lowest people got to witness the miracle, not the bride and groom or the rich and powerful. Those serving the needs of the guest experienced the sign of God's love.

We can now understand why Isaiah proclaims:

"For Zion's sake I will not be silent,

for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet . . .

As a young man marries a virgin,

your Builder shall marry you;

and as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride

so shall your God rejoice in you."

Jesus has come to us all and revealed himself to those most forgotten or ignored by society, in the action of everyday life. He was not flashy with his miracle or draw attention to his actions. He simply asked for stone jars to be filled with water and then some drawn for the headwaiter to taste.

All those gathered at the wedding experienced the miracle, but each in their own way, similar to the gifts of the spirit from the letter of Paul we read today. We all experience the presence of God in the actions and motions of our daily life. Spend some time this week sharing your experiences of God with those closest to you.


New Family Enrollment at Holy Family
