From the Pastor

Lent is considered a penitential season. From our focus in our readings, to our prayers during Mass, to our communal abstinence from meat on Fridays, it seems that many things in our church life reminds us of the church's desire that we take on some acts of penance as we prepare for Easter.

I'd like to encourage everyone to seek out some penance by going to confession during Lent. The church asks us to go once a year, and this has been a difficult year to do that, but also a pretty necessary year to go and receive that forgiveness from God, and the grace to do better in the year ahead. And if you go with me, more than likely the penance won't be that bad!

A penance is like a small token to make up for what we have done. I like to describe it as cleaning up the mess. For instance, if a child spills some orange juice on the ground, their parents will forgive them, but the orange juice still needs to be cleaned up, right? That is basically what a penance does for us, it serves to clean things up, just a bit.

And if you have not been to confession in a long time, even longer than a year, please do not worry, I understand and will help you through it. No judgment if you can't remember the act of contrition either, the main thing is to say sorry for your sins, and I will walk you through that as well.

I put a picture of the confessional on the front of the bulletin, sometimes seeing the place helps us to be comfortable with it. We have been having confession in the cry room since May and it has been working well. There are more options than even what you can see for seating, please sit wherever you are most comfortable. Also, there is a behind the screen option, sitting or kneeling, in case that makes you more comfortable. The main thing is that you come and receive God's mercy and forgiveness. Readings for the 2nd Sunday in Lent

Note: text in *italics* should be recited by the congregation when the responses are not sung.

Entrance Antiphon: Psalm 27:8-9

Of you my heart has spoken: Seek his face. It is your face, O Lord, that I seek; hide not your face from me.

First Reading: Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18

God put Abraham to the test. He called to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am!" he replied. Then God said: "Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust on a height that I will point out to you." When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. Then he reached out and took the knife to slaughter his son. But the LORD's messenger called to him from heaven, "Abraham, Abraham!" "Here I am!" he answered. "Do not lay your hand on the boy," said the messenger. "Do not do the least thing to him. I know now how devoted you are to God, since you did not withhold from me your own beloved son." ...

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 116:10, 15, 16-17, 18-19

R./ I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living.

Second Reading: Romans 8:31b-34

Brothers and sisters: If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all, how will he not also give us everything else along with him? Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? It is God who acquits us, who will condemn? Christ Jesus it is who died—or, rather, was raised—who also is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us.

Gospel: Mark 9:2-10

Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them. As they were coming down from the mountain, he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone, except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what rising from the dead meant.

Communion Antiphon: Matthew 17:5
