Feast of the Holy Family

Marriage and raising children breaks us out of our self-centeredness. We cannot remain happy as a married person and a parent if we refuse to give up our position as being the center of the universe. This is so because being a parent constantly forces a person to leave their own small world of selfish interests and reach out in love and care to another human being. From the middle of the night feedings, to the personal hygiene of your child (including above all, the changing of diapers whenever and wherever), through to the wiping off of faces covered with baby food to all the millions of things you are called upon to do to help your child grow, you are constantly being called out of your selfish self.

And it doesn't end when our kids no longer need us for all the survival stuff. As they grow and become more and more independent, we still carry them in our hearts. Many parents still lose sleep over their adult children.

But what about the children? As we look at the reading from the book of Sirach, we can clearly see that belonging to a family is a two-way street. Family relationships are meant to flow in both directions. Children, who receive so much from their parents, are asked to return respect and kindness to their fathers and mothers. We know that in this day and age, this can become a serious problem. Because we're living so much longer than in previous eras, many people have parents who need some kind of support for many, many years.

And so belonging to a holy family requires the same thing, whether we are a child or a parent, or both a child and a parent—we need to love, and we need to make that love visible to one another. In the words of the opening prayer, "...help us to live as the holy family, united in respect and love."






