## **Epiphany of the Lord**

Desire took the wise men on a journey. Deep within them they burned to find this infant king of the Jews and they went to great lengths to fulfill their desire. In a way, desire controls our lives. It lives within each one of us. There are no exceptions. "We are so overcharged with desire that it is hard to come to simple rest. Desire is always stronger than satisfaction".

We can name this desire as a holy longing because it is placed there by the only one whom we call holy—God. God has created this holy longing within each one of us. That is why there are no exceptions. We all carry this longing deep within us, throughout our entire lives. This desire is so central to our existence that it is not an exaggeration to say that the story of our lives is the story of what we do with that desire.

We're all chasing something or, what is most likely, we are all chasing many things. When we find ourselves travelling down too many paths at the same time, we experience a feeling that life is too much to handle. We have too many irons in the fire. If we find ourselves without any focus, any real center to our lives, then we need to pull back and take a long hard, honest look at where we are heading.

Many of us need to dramatically simplify our lives. We have too much, do too much, and want too much. Our basic desire for God and for completeness has been sidetracked. On the other hand, when we allow our desire to lead us to more compassion, greater kindness, caring for others, faithfulness in our marriage and friendships, then we will have allowed that desire to lead us in the right direction. As God directed the hearts of the wise men, may God also direct our hearts as we continue to seek the one thing necessary.





## St. Elizabeth Ann Seton **January 4**

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 - January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint." ©LPi
