Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Many of you have heard the saying that, "People are lonely because they build walls instead of bridges." It is probably just as true to say that, "People are imprisoned because they build walls instead of bridges." These images of walls and bridges can be very useful tools for us as we try to understand what Jesus was talking about in today's Gospel passage.

Jesus read these words from the prophet Isaiah: The Spirit...has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free...In other words, Jesus came to bring freedom, Jesus is our liberator.

Our own lives are full of walls. Walls keep us from knowing and loving. Walls of prejudice keep people from learning about each other. Walls of judgement keep people from discovering what is common and worthy of respect in others. Walls of status keep different classes of people from influencing each other. Some walls we inherit from our parents or our culture—others we build ourselves.

Our task is not to build walls. It is to build bridges, to connect ourselves to others. Building bridges means allowing others to be an important part of our lives. It's true that if we continually shut people out of our lives, we will end up lonely and unhappy. But we will also end up enslaved in our own small prison. We need to work at building bridges, which will connect our lives with the lives of others.

We have a strong need to also build bridges with God. We do this through prayer, meditation, reading, community worship, contemplating the wonders of the world. Jesus has called us to the deepest freedom that a person can experience. Now we need to accept that remarkable call and respond to it with all that is within us. We are called to be free.

Open Your Hearts to Our New Neighbors

We know your hearts are full. Saint Vincent de Paul is currently helping families throughout Racine County with housing, utilities, food, clothing, kitchen and bedding kits, as well as a weekly hot meal program supported by Catholic parishes and other caring churches.

During August of 2021, thousands of Afghan families, most of whom supported our military for many years, were forced overnight to flee their homeland with nothing but the clothes on their backs. As their country entered a new dark age, they fled to a new life in a land full of hope. In a few days over 100,000 Afghan refugees were flown into eight military bases in the United States, and have been housed there ever since.

The call went out to help a people who had helped us, and SVDP answered that call co-sponsoring with another faith-filled community, North Pointe Methodist Church. Together we will help Afghan families acclimate to life in Racine by obtaining employment, accessing transportation, food, clothing, ESL classes, tutoring, etc.

We are not alone in this worthy venture as Sacred Heart Parish and Holy Communion Lutheran Church are both independently sponsoring a family. St. Mesrob Armenian and the Racine Interfaith Coalition are also co-sponsoring a family. We hope that other Catholic parishes are moved to sponsor an Afghan family. SVDP and North Pointe will soon be introduced to a new family and our experiences will be passed on to smooth the way for other churches.

We are asking that you consider giving additionally to Saint Vincent de Paul this month in order that we can help these families, as well as continue our daily outreach within the community. We will be designating our SVDP collection on January 30th as an "extra giving" Sunday for SVDP Afghan Refugee Relief. Thank you so much in advance for your continued generosity and support of our neighbors.


