FROM FR. JERRY

One of the undeniable trends in our country, our state, and our local communities is increasing secularization. People are becoming more secular or worldly in their values and actions and less religious in their beliefs and practices.

Our diocese took a painful but honest look at trends over the last thirty years. Mass attendance, Confirmation, Baptisms, and Weddings are in a slow but steady path of decline. Facts are stubborn things and we cannot wish them away or ignore them. Blaming bishops, priests, parents, religious educators, Dr. Spock, hippies or the media doesn't address the problem or solve anything.

Our diocese is embarking on a lengthy process of moving the local church from maintenance to mission. In other words, it is not enough for us to try to maintain our numbers of registered members or our parish programs. That is self-serving. We are called, by our baptism, to be a missionary church. Our mission is to call others to church and to become his disciples, just as we are. Change is nearly always accompanied by discomfort, anxiety, and even fear. But, in the words of St. Joan of Arc who faced persecution and trial: "We are born for this." We are born to new life in baptism, and are entrusted with Christ's mission to call the world to salvation in His name.

You will be hearing more about this in the future. For now, let us recall what our mission as Christ's people is. Let us strengthen ourselves by the Gospel and Sacraments. Let us be willing to be taught ourselves. Let us trust in Christ's presence in us and the Holy Spirit who will give us the courage and the words to speak to the hearts of those who are hungry and thirsty for those things the world cannot give and those things which guarantee us peace, joy, and an everlasting place in God's kingdom.

Thanks to the tremendous support we continue to receive from our parishioners, our revenue for Fiscal 2021 amounted to \$701,350. As we anticipated, this was lower than our prior year (Fiscal 2020) due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. COVID-19 impacted Fiscal 2021 throughout the year, compared to it affecting Fiscal 2020 for four months - March to June. Our weekly First Collections and Eye on the Future (Building Fund) Collections were a combined \$31,000 lower than the prior year; however, we were blessed with Gifts, Bequests and Memorials of over \$112,000, which was almost \$13,000 higher than prior year. Additionally, the overall reduction of parish activities negatively impacted our revenues.

With the reduction in revenue, the parish staff prudently reduced expenses while keeping the Parish maintained both administratively and physically. Our total Operating Expenses were \$653,000, which was \$84,000 lower than prior year. The reduction in expenses enabled us to have Operating Income of \$47,000 for the year.

Outside of our normal operating activities, we have invested funds, largely from the Eye on the Future (Building Fund). As with any building, as our beautiful church ages, certain expenses will arise in order to maintain the infrastructure. Our invested funds are held to offset these future expenses. The good news this past year is that the stock market went up considerably, and so the value of our funds increased by \$78,000, versus a loss in the value of these funds in the prior year.

On a final note, due to the support Holy Family has received through the years our Parish continues to be in a financially secure position. Nobody knows what this year will bring as COVID-19 continues to impact our nation and our church. As noted last year, we did receive a Government Loan through the Payroll Protection Program (PPP), as did many other organizations. The first loan was converted to a grant during the past fiscal year, however it is not included in the above numbers as we focused on normal operating activities. The grant enabled us to maintain employment for our staff during these challenging times.

HAPPY 30TH ORDINATION ANNIVERSARY, FR. JERRY!

Fr. Jerry celebrated his 30 year ordination anniversary on November 3, 2021.

The Knights of Columbus threw a special cake and coffee party for him after the Masses the weekend of October 30 & 31.



The money raised from the CSA is invaluable, both to the diocese and our parish. Besides helping to cover the cost of the diocese's operation, CSA money brings resources and assistance *to our parish*, as well as others within the diocese. Here are some examples of your CSA dollars at work *right here*:

Respect Life Ministry: The diocese works to implement the guidelines of the USCCB Pastoral Plan for Pro-Life Activities. Cathy Wiechering, Holy Family's Respect Life activities volunteer, receives communication from Bonita Thom, who is in charge of the diocese's Respect Life activities. Bonita furnishes items for our bulletin and for the Respect Life Month table. She alerts us to pro-life organizations that need our assistance. Holy Family is one of two churches in the diocese that is in charge of the fetus models. Cathy displayed those at our Respect Life table during the month of October. The diocese gave us responsibility of these models to display and to lend to other churches and any interested parishioners. Thank you, CSA.

Promotes vocations, helps underwrite cost of educating seminarians: This year our diocese has six seminarians. Although none of them serve our church directly at this time, they may in the future. We all know there is a priest shortage. The diocese, with the help of the CSA, is doing what it can to grow our priesthood. Thank you, CSA.

Permanent Diaconate: Helps men (and their wives/families) discern a call to the permanent diaconate by providing in-depth formation, continuing education, service agreements, retreats, family support and much more. We are blessed with two deacon candidates – Bob King and Jason Martin. They attend formation weekends that are part of their education toward becoming deacons. Please see the accompanying article for more information. Thank you, CSA.

Ecclesial Ministries and Diocesan Consultation: Implements training, workshops, and in-services for parish leadership development, parish pastoral and finance councils, and conflict resolution. They also sponsor School of Servant Leadership, Professional Development Days and Lay Ministry Enrichment Days. Our staff, volunteers, and ministers often take advantage of these offerings. Professional Development Days and Lay Ministry Enrichment Days are free of charge to the participants. I personally benefitted from the services of Chris Newkirk at the diocese in the parish I used to work in. She helped with conflict resolution, and gave a workshop to our Pastoral Council. These services, and more, are available to our parish, as well. Thank you, CSA.

Resource for pastors, parish directors, etc., who are responsible for sacramental liturgical prep and celebrations, and educational and formational events on liturgical topics: Every year, the Diocese holds a Priest Retreat. The Office of Worship provides guidance for those in liturgical roles, and through their office, we get a discount on the lector books. We recently had two members become trained and certified as Lay Leaders of Prayer which will enable them to join others in presiding at Word & Communion services in the church and for those who are hospitalized or in senior living facilities. Pre-COVID, the Diocese held an annual music workshop for cantors, musicians, and choir members. Holy Family has hosted that workshop at times in the past. The resources and the presenters are phenomenal. Thank you, CSA.

Assist for Religious Education, sacramental prep, youth ministry adult formation and family ministry: Extreme Faith Camp, Totus Tuus, catechetical certification, and retreats are much needed services for those of our parish who minister to our youth. The Diocese provides a couple of large workshops – one in August, one in October – to provide inspiration and guidance to our staff and volunteers who work with Faith Formation as well as curriculum suggestions and certification. Thank you, CSA.

As you can see, although the CSA may seem like a “tax” on our parish, the money transforms into vital services. If you have already given to the CSA, we thank you. Dear Holy Family Parishioners,

We are humbled and grateful for your continued prayers and generous financial support as we continue our journey through diaconate formation! Whether it's a friendly word shared with us in the colonnade, helping us with some of our field work, or just hearing that you're including us in your prayers, your kindness and generosity keep us inspired.

We recently began our third year of formation which is facilitated through the Diocese of La Crosse. As in the past two years, we'll be away for formation one weekend per month through May. This year, those weekends are split between La Crosse and Wausau. The wonderful news is that the facilities at both locations are spacious enough to allow for sufficient social distancing which has enabled our wives to rejoin us. The space constraints at last year's facility in Marathon did not allow for as many participants and so Michelle and Kim missed out on their part of formation as deacon wives.

A significant part of our next three years of formation is related to Pastoral Field Education. PFE is integral to the formation of permanent deacons and is intended to give us practical experience in many areas of the Church that a deacon may be involved in or called upon at some time to serve. Over the course of the next six semesters, we'll be actively involved in such Holy Family ministries as youth faith formation, adult evangelization, RCIA, marriage and family, charity, parish structure, and preparations for the various sacraments. This hands-on work will help us discern our calling, develop our unique gifts and talents, and help develop a greater awareness of the needs and mission of Holy Family. Fr. Jerry is serving as our PFE Supervisor and we meet with him monthly for guidance, support, and accountability.


In addition to Pastoral Field Education, this year of formation includes concentrations in the Old Testament, Patristics (the early church fathers), Pastoral Ministry, Vatican II Foundations, Ecclesiology, and Christian Anthropology.

Through the Diocese of Superior, we were both recently trained and certified as Lay Leaders of Prayer. This certification enables us to lead Word & Communion services in the church as

well as for those who are hospitalized or in senior housing. We are also able to lead *Sunday Celebration in the Absence of a Priest* as well as certain aspects of liturgies from the Order of Christian Funerals.

As we seep deeper into our faith journeys, please know that we keep you in our daily prayers. We thank you for continuing to pray for us.




Holly Spiegelhoff, Director of Liturgy & Music


