

THE ST. BERNARD'S MEN'S CLUB will not be having a First Friday fish fry in January. Please join us on February 4th.



The parish office will be closed Friday, December 31st for the New Year's Holiday. Sophia's Kitchen will be closed until January 3rd.









You need not be a biological mother who has carried a child in her womb to be a mother in spirit. Who in your world needs you to love them with the heart of a mother?



St. Stephen | Feast Day December 26



The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. A man filled with grace and power, he worked great wonders among the people. Some Jews debated with St. Stephen but could not match his wisdom and spirit. Eventually, a charge of blasphemy was brought up against him, and the local population demanded that he be tried and sentenced. He was seized and carried before the Sanhedrin.

Despite the danger he faced, in front of the Sanhedrin and his accusers, St. Stephen gave a long speech about the history of Israel and the blessings that God had given upon His chosen people. He talked about how Israel had become disobedient despite God's abundant mercy. This enraged his accusers, and eventually the crowd dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death.

Even in his final moments, St. Stephen displayed great forgiveness and even asked God not to hold the sins of his attackers against them. Hundreds of years after his death, he is still a role model for us to follow.

Querida familia, muy buena semana, estamos transitando uno de los tiempos más lindos que podemos vivir en torno a nuestra fe, junto con la Pascua, la navidad es un tiempo fuerte. Hermoso, no más importantes que los otros, pero este tiempo tiene un espíritu que solo nosotros, los cristianos, los disfrutamos mucho y caminamos en la Fe. La navidad, ha dejado en nuestros corazones la inquietud de seguir creciendo en santidad y con el niño recién nacido gozamos de la gracia del Dios. Hoy estamos celebrando la Sagrada Familia de Nazaret y la frase con la cual me quiero quedar es la siguiente: ***“Hijo mío, ¿por qué te has portado así con nosotros? Tu padre y yo te hemos estado buscando llenos de angustia”***. Él les respondió: ***“¿Por qué me andaban buscando? ¿No sabían que debo ocuparme en las cosas de mi Padre?”***. ¿piensan en lo que María sufrió en este momento con la desaparición de su hijo?, ¿Qué sentirían ustedes si un hijo de ustedes se pierde hoy?, ¿Qué pasaría en su corazón si no logran comunicarse con sus hijos luego de perderse?. José y María estaban angustiados, porque en esta peregrinación que estaban haciendo a Jerusalén, el corazón de las peregrinaciones en la confesión de Fe judía, había mucha gente. No habrá sido difícil no conseguir lugar para quedarse o inclusive comer ya que a Jerusalén iba mucha gente. Hoy estos padres sienten angustia porque se les pierde el hijo, el niño queda en Jerusalén con los doctores de la ley. Ahora, quiero que pensemos en nosotros, ¿por qué?, nosotros somos hijos y no dejaremos de ser hijos aunque querríamos apartarnos de Dios, si recibimos el bautismo somos hijos y seguiremos siendo hijos siempre. Ahora, en mi experiencia muchas veces nos perdemos en el templo –del mundo– solo para alejarnos de la gracia de Dios o porque renegamos de su amor. Y esta angustia la siente nuestra Madre del cielo. Vamos a poner una imagen: Muchas veces he sido testigo de como los hijos, una vez que se van de las casas, dejan de hablar con sus padres y a lo mejor es porque ahora tienen más actividades o simplemente porque ahora ya no los necesitan, o si los papas están viejos los metemos en un asilo de ancianos porque nadie tiene tiempo de cuidarlos o simplemente los dejamos solos. Yo como sacerdote he visitado muchos asilos de ancianos y abuelos solos: ¿saben cual es el dolor más grande de los padres?, pensar que su propios hijos los olvidaron. Eso los destruye, inclusive hasta la muerte. Esto parece fuerte pero es verdad. La pregunta es: ¿Nuestro Padre del Cielo sufre igual cuando nos olvidamos de El?, no podríamos decir que si en el sentido literal porque en Dios no hay sufrimiento. Pero de forma análoga debemos decir que sí, Dios sufre cada vez que nos alejamos de El. Como sufren José y María hoy, nuestro Padre celestial lo hace. Creo que aquí esta el punto de reflexión, vivir la fe como una familia. En donde hay un Padre que nos ama e hijos que debemos vivir como el Padre sueña. Pensar la Fe como una familia nos debe llevar, primero, a fortalecer la familia y desde ella pensar y vivir la Fe como lo haría una familia. Pero en la actualidad esto es un problema. La familia está siendo atacada desde todos los ángulos que podamos imaginarnos. Por eso creo que esta imagen esta difícil de entender. Pero debemos apostar en esta fiesta a revitalizar la familia. Entonces mi propuesta es: no pierdas tiempo, corre, visita a tus padres, gasta el tiempo con ellos. No trabajes tanto a llegar no estar nunca en tu casa con tus hijos, tus hijos no quieren tu plata quieren tu amor. Corre a gastar tiempo con tu esposa y esposo y hablar sobre lo que viven, sufren o les pasa. Pregunta a tus hijos como están, siéntate con ellos; y aunque ellos no hablen, sobre todo si son adolescentes, solo gasta el tiempo con ellos. Y si se hace difícil, contempla la Sagrada Familia y sigue su ejemplo. Rezo por esto. Dios te Bendiga. Padre Julio.
