

Pandemic Saints

Say a Prayer to Some Pandemic Saints
There are many saints you could pray to as part of this pandemic we've been through, but we picked these three because we like them. Feel free to offer a prayer to one of these.

St. Aloysius Gonzaga At the beginning of 1591, a plague broke out in Rome. After begging alms for the victims, Aloysius Gonzaga began working with the sick, carrying the dying from the streets into a hospital founded by the Jesuits. There he washed and fed the plague victims, preparing them as best he could to receive the sacraments. But though he threw himself into his tasks, he privately confessed to his spiritual director that he was sickened by the sights and smells of the patients. Despite all that, Aloysius continued helping the sick, until he fell ill himself. He willed himself to live until the Feast of Corpus Christi. And on that day, two Jesuits came to give him communion. He rallied long enough to receive the host and then he died. He was only 23 years old.

St. Roch The son of a wealthy family in the early 14th century, Roch was born with a striking red cross across his chest. After his parents died when he was only 20, he gave his family's property to his uncle and then donated all the rest of his fortune to the poor. Setting out to Italy, Roch began visiting plague-infested cities, curing its citizens by showing the cross that was on his chest. Everywhere he went, the terrible scourge vanished, and those supernatural powers made St. Roch the talk of Italy. After finally catching the disease himself, he withdrew to obscurity and healed. Then he returned to France in disguise, was mistakenly arrested for a spy, and eventually dying in prison.

St. Rosalia Rosalia was born in the 12th century into a Norman family said to be descended from Charlemagne. Intensely religious, she decided to devote her life to prayer and sacrifice in a cave on Mount Pellegrino, where she inscribed on a wall: "I, Rosalia have taken the resolution to live in this cave for the love of my Lord, Jesus Christ." Five hundred years later, when Palermo was being decimated by a plague, St. Rosalia appeared in a dream to a hunter, and told him where her bones could be found. Then he was to bring them to Palermo. The people of the town carried her remains throughout the city, and the plague ended. Soon after, St. Rosalia became the patron saint of Palermo, and a sanctuary was built where her remains were recovered.



St. Thomas Aquinas | January 28



One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 - 1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The *Summa Theologiae*, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today.

***Después de que Jesús fue tentado por el demonio en el desierto***

Después de Su bautismo, Jesús "... fue llevado por el Espíritu en el desierto por cuarenta días, siendo tentado por el diablo..." (Lucas 4:1-2). Las tres tentaciones en el desierto fueron un intento por seducir la lealtad de Jesús a Dios y rendirla a Satanás. Vemos una tentación similar en Mateo 16:21-23 donde Satanás, a través de Pedro, intenta que Jesús renuncie a la cruz para la que fue destinado. Lucas 4:13 nos dice que después de las tentaciones en el desierto, Satanás "...se alejó de Él esperando un tiempo oportuno." Lo que parece indicar que Jesús posteriormente fue tentado por Satanás, aunque los siguientes incidentes no quedaron registrados. El punto importante es que, a pesar de las varias tentaciones, Él jamás pecó.

Es claro que Dios tenía un propósito al permitir que Jesús fuera tentado en el desierto, de acuerdo a la declaración de "fue llevado por el Espíritu en el desierto". Un propósito era asegurarnos que tenemos un Sumo Sacerdote quien es capaz de compadecerse de todas nuestras debilidades (Hebreos 4:15) porque Él fue tentado en todas las áreas, al igual que nosotros somos tentados. La naturaleza humana de nuestro Señor, le permite que Él pueda compadecerse de nuestras debilidades, porque Él también fue sometido a debilidad. "Pues en cuanto Él mismo fue tentado en el sufrimiento, es poderoso para socorrer a los que son tentados." (Hebreos 2:18). La palabra griega traducida aquí como "tentado" significa "poner a prueba." Así que, cuando somos puestos a prueba y atribulados por las circunstancias de la vida, podemos asegurar que Jesús comprende y se compadece como alguien que ha pasado por las mismas pruebas.

Las tentaciones de Jesús siguen tres patrones que son comunes para todos los hombres: La primera tentación tiene que ver con los deseos de la carne (Mateo 4:3-4), lo cual incluye toda clase de deseos físicos. Nuestro Señor estaba hambriento, y el diablo lo tentó a convertir las piedras en panes, pero Él respondió citando Deuteronomio 8:3. La segunda tentación fue concerniente al orgullo de la vida (Mateo 4:5-7), y aquí el diablo trató de usar un pasaje de la Escritura contra Él (Salmo 91:11-2) pero el Señor nuevamente respondió con la Escritura de manera opuesta (Deuteronomio 6:16), declarando que sería un error que Él abusara de Sus propios poderes. La tercera tentación es respecto al deseo de los ojos (Mateo 4:8-10), y si hubiera una ruta rápida por la que el Mesías pudiera cumplir su misión evitando la pasión y crucifixión para lo que Él originalmente vino, sería ésta. El diablo ya tenía control sobre los reinos del mundo (Efesios 2:2), pero estaba listo para cederle todo a Cristo a cambio de Su lealtad. El solo pensarlo casi causa que la divina naturaleza del Señor se estremeciera, y Él contesta bruscamente, "AL SEÑOR TU DIOS ADORARÁS, Y SOLO A ÉL SERVIRÁS." (Mateo 4:10; Deuteronomio 6:13).

Hay muchas tentaciones en las que caemos porque nuestra carne es débil por naturaleza, pero "fiel es Dios, que no permitirá que vosotros seáis tentados más allá de lo que podéis soportar, sino que con la tentación proveerá también la vía de escape, a fin de que podáis resistirla." (1 Corintios 10:13). Por tanto podemos obtener la victoria y agradecerle a Dios por librarnos de la tentación. La experiencia de Jesús en el desierto, nos ayuda a ver estas tentaciones comunes que nos impiden servirle a Dios eficazmente. Más aún, de las respuestas de Jesús a las tentaciones, aprendemos exactamente cómo debemos responder – con la Escritura. Las fuerzas del mal vienen a nosotros con miradas de tentaciones, pero todas ellas contienen las mismas tres cosas en su esencia: la pasión de la carne, la pasión de los ojos y la arrogancia de la vida (1 Juan 2:16). Solo podemos reconocer y combatir estas tentaciones, saturando nuestros corazones y nuestras mentes con la verdad. La armadura del soldado cristiano en la batalla espiritual, incluye solo una arma ofensiva, la espada del Espíritu, la cual es la Palabra de Dios (Efesios 6:17). El conocer la Biblia íntimamente pondrá la espada del espíritu en nuestras manos y nos permitirá salir victoriosos de las tentaciones.

Lc 1, 1-4; 4, 14-21 Muchos han tratado de escribir la historia de las cosas que pasaron entre nosotros, tal y como nos las traspusieron los que las vieron desde el principio y que ayudaron en la predicación. Yo también, ilustre Teófilo, después de haberme informado minuciosamente de todo, desde sus principios, pensé escribírtelo por orden, para que veas la verdad de lo que se te ha enseñado. (**Después de que Jesús fue tentado por el demonio en el desierto**), impulsado por el Espíritu, volvió a Galilea. Iba enseñando en las sinagogas; todos lo alababan y su fama se extendió por toda la región. Fue también a Nazaret, donde se había criado. Entró en la sinagoga, como era su costumbre hacerlo los sábados, y se levantó para hacer la lectura. Se le dio el volumen del profeta Isaías, lo desenrolló y encontró el pasaje en que estaba escrito: El espíritu del Señor está sobre mí, porque me ha ungido para llevar a los pobres la buena nueva, para anunciar la liberación a los cautivos y la curación a los ciegos, para dar libertad a los oprimidos y proclamar el año de gracia del Señor. Enrolló el volumen, lo devolvió al encargado y se sentó. Los ojos de todos los asistentes a la sinagoga estaban fijos en él. Entonces comenzó a hablar, diciendo: "Hoy mismo se ha cumplido este pasaje de la Escritura que acaban de oír"




