

Can you believe we begin a New Year this weekend? Time sure has a way of flying by, almost so quickly that it is easy to miss the beauty of each day given to us.

I pray that 2022 will be a better year for all of us. 
Ball-Chatham Food Pantry will be the recipient. They are in need of canned vegetables and canned fruit, chili, sugar,

Baptism Preparation Classes


Parents who would like to have their child baptized at St. Joseph the Worker are required to attend a preparation class. The next classes will be:


Mission Statement of St. Joseph the Worker Parish
