This week we call to mind two events that have shaped our world—one for the better and one not.

Right to Life

Governor JB Pritzker signed a law on Friday, December 17, 2021, that ends parental notification, a requirement that doctors notify the parents of a minor seeking an abortion. The repeal of parental notification is scheduled to go into effect on June 1, 2022.

State Representative Avery Bourne (R-Morrisonville) said in a statement, "Today's bill signing by the governor strips parents of their basic right to know what is happening in their minor daughter's life. Even more concerning, removing this common sense protection will increase the likelihood of sexual abuse, exploitation and allow the trafficking of minor girls to continue unchecked."

Amy Gehrke, executive director of Illinois Right to Life, issued a statement saying Pritzker usurped the right of Illinois parents to be involved in their children's health care, and endangered countless minor girls by signing HB 370, repealing Illinois' Parental Notice of Abortion law.
