Today's Gospel: Jn 2:1-11

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine."

And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

Reflection: The First Miracle, fruit of loving concern

In John's gospel the mother of Jesus is mentioned just twice: at the marriage feast at Cana, the beginning of the public ministry of Jesus and at the crucifixion, the end of it. That could be a way of telling us that the role played by Mary was not just the fact of her being the mother of Jesus, but that she was *actively* involved with Jesus in the work of our redemption. We have read that at the marriage feast at Cana, Mary was invited as well as Jesus himself and his disciples. As the feasting went on and the wine ran short, Mary took the initiative to intercede with Jesus and he performed what turned out to be his first miracle, the *first of his signs*.

How did Mary know what her son could do? Other interesting questions could arise from the story. Did Mary know back in Nazareth that she was living with a person who could work miracles and yet never once ask him to multiply her bread, or double her money to make ends meet? After all, one might think, charity begins at home. But for Mary and for Jesus the will of God came first.

Jesus somehow knew he had this power to enhance the lives of others. After his forty days fast in the dessert he was hungry and the devil suggested it to him to turn some stones into bread for his own use, but he did not do it. Yet he later multiplied bread for crowds of his hungry followers to eat. What does the Cana miracle tell us? Is it that God's special gifts are not meant primarily for our personal benefit but for the service of others. That is what St Paul says when he lists examples of different gifts of the Holy Spirit and adds that "to each person is given the manifestation of the Spirit *for the common good*."

What gifts has God given me? Am I using these gifts for some service in the community?" We may wonder why there are no more manifestations of the Holy Spirit like what we read in the Bible. Maybe if we began better using the gifts we have for the common good – like the gift of praying, singing, teaching, caring, sharing, encouraging, supporting, motivating, writing, etc. – then we might begin to see miracles. Concern for others is the basic miracle.

El Evangelio: Jn 2, 1-11

En aquel tiempo, hubo una boda en Caná de Galilea, a la cual asistió la madre de Jesús. Éste y sus discípulos también fueron invitados. Como llegara a faltar el vino, María le dijo a Jesús: “Ya no tienen vino”. Jesús le contestó: “Mujer, ¿qué podemos hacer tú y yo? Todavía no llega mi hora”. Pero ella dijo a los que servían: “Hagan lo que él les diga”.

Había allí seis tinajas de piedra, de unos cien litros cada una, que servían para las purificaciones de los judíos. Jesús dijo a los que servían: “Llenen de agua esas tinajas”. Y las llenaron hasta el borde. Entonces les dijo: “Saquen ahora un poco y llévenselo al mayordomo”.

Así lo hicieron, y en cuanto el mayordomo probó el agua convertida en vino, sin saber su procedencia, porque sólo los sirvientes la sabían, llamó al novio y le dijo: “Todo el mundo sirve primero el vino mejor, y cuando los invitados ya han bebido bastante, se sirve el corriente. Tú, en cambio, has guardado el vino mejor hasta ahora”.

Esto que hizo Jesús en Caná de Galilea fue el primero de sus signos. Así manifestó su gloria y sus discípulos creyeron en él.

Reflexión: El Primer Milagro, fruto de la preocupación amorosa

En el evangelio de Juan, la madre de Jesús se menciona solo dos veces: en las bodas de Caná, el comienzo del ministerio público de Jesús y en la crucifixión, el final del mismo. Esa podría ser una forma de decirnos que el papel que jugó María no fue sólo el hecho de ser la madre de Jesús, sino que estuvo activamente involucrada con Jesús en la obra de nuestra redención. Hemos leído que en las bodas de Caná, María fue invitada, así como el mismo Jesús y sus discípulos. A medida que avanzaba la fiesta y el vino escaseaba, María tomó la iniciativa de interceder ante Jesús y él realizó lo que resultó ser su primer milagro, la primera de sus señales.

¿Cómo supo María lo que su hijo podía hacer? Otras preguntas interesantes podrían surgir de la historia. ¿Sabía María en Nazaret que estaba viviendo con una persona que podía hacer milagros y, sin embargo, nunca le pidió que le multiplicara el pan o le doblara el dinero para llegar a fin de mes? Despues de todo, se podría pensar, la caridad comienza en casa. Pero para María y para Jesús la voluntad de Dios estaba primero.

Jesús de alguna manera sabía que tenía este poder para mejorar la vida de los demás. Después de sus cuarenta días de ayuno en el desierto tuvo hambre y el diablo le sugirió convertir unas piedras en pan para su propio uso, pero no lo hizo. Sin embargo, más tarde multiplicó el pan para que comieran multitudes de sus seguidores hambrientos. ¿Qué nos dice el milagro de Caná? ¿Es que los dones especiales de Dios no están destinados principalmente a nuestro beneficio personal sino al servicio de los demás? Eso es lo que dice san Pablo cuando enumera ejemplos de los diferentes dones del Espíritu Santo y añade que “a cada uno le es dada la manifestación del Espíritu para el bien común”.

¿Qué dones me ha dado Dios? ¿Estoy usando estos dones para algún servicio en la comunidad?” Podemos preguntarnos por qué no hay más manifestaciones del Espíritu Santo como las que leemos en la Biblia. Tal vez si empezáramos a usar mejor los dones que tenemos para el bien común, como el don de orar, cantar, enseñar, cuidar, compartir, alentar, apoyar, motivar, escribir, etc., entonces podríamos comenzar a ver milagros. La preocupación por los demás es el milagro básico.


