

Epiphany House Blessing

April 15

The feast of the Epiphany (or Twelfth Night) celebrates the coming of the Magi to adore the Christ child. On this day, Christians blessed their homes using holy water and incense. They marked the exterior (and sometimes interior) doorways with chalk that remained until the following year. They prayed that peace, love and mutual respect would abide in the hearts of all who resided there.

For our new year, all parish families are invited to mark with chalk the lintel of the main door of your home with the symbol 20+C+M+B+22. It stands for the current year and the names of the three wise men (Casper, Melchior, and Balthazar). It also stands for the Latin phrase Christus mansionem benedicat (May Christ Bless This Home). As a family, walk through the rooms of the house with a candle singing carols such as We Three Kings and The Twelve Days of Christmas. Conclude the blessing with a feast.
