

# St. Blaise - February 3rd

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise,
bishop and martyr,
may God deliver you from ailments
of the throat and from every other evil.
In the name of the Father, and of the Son,
and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Join us on February 3rd at Immaculate Conception for the 7:00am Mass or St. Augustine at the 8:30am Mass for the "blessing of throats".

# The Prayer of the Faithful

The Prayer of the Faithful – offered after the Creed, is really several intercessory prayers offered first for the Church, then the world. Next we pray for our parish, Sacred Heart of Jesus, then the sick and dying, and those who have died. Our final prayer offerings are for the intention of the liturgy and then for the intentions we hold in our heart.

Where do these prayers come from? The liturgy commission has a sub-group of parish members who write the petitions using the Scripture readings for that weekend as inspiration.

Intercessory prayer is a key part of what we do as members of the Body of Christ. We may ask someone to pray for us or a special intention when we or someone we care about is hurting in some way. Some people I have known in my life are so in tune with the Holy Spirit that they have asked me if every one in my family is ok, because God has put them on their hearts to pray for them. And they were right. Someone did need prayer.

One of our Saints in the Pews used to call for prayer for their grandson. I loved that she would later call and let us know that our prayers were answered and thank us for praying. This past week a baby girl was born safely and healthy after her mother faced medical challenges. A thank you 'for praying me into the world' came to us after her birth.

So don't hesitate to ask for prayers, or to offer prayers when God puts someone on your heart. It's what we do for one another.
