THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. - Mt 2:10-11

From the Pastor

Of all the festivities that surround the celebration of Christ's birth, the oldest observance is the Feast of the Epiphany, which the early Christian community celebrated even before they celebrated the Feast of Christmas. Today marks the manifestation of Christ to all the nations as these Wise Men journey to give homage to the infant Jesus. Jesus came to live among us as the savior of all peoples, Jew and Gentile alike. The Magi represent all of those who were not followers of the God of Israel, but were, nonetheless, attracted to the light of Christ. Their arrival fulfilled the prophesy of Isaiah, "*All nations on earth are enlightened by the birth of this child.*"

These mysterious figures of the Nativity whom we call the Magi remind us also that to follow the light of Christ, we may well be called to take risks. They set out following a star, yet their route was far from secure. To follow Christ may mean that we will not always be a success as the world judges' success, but it does mean that our lives will be marked by fidelity to the struggle.

We may have to search and journey in our lives of faith, as well as act upon our faith. For faith is not just something we talk about, it also requires action. We are called to take the risks of loving others and serving their needs, thus accomplishing a greater good which is beyond ourselves. We live our faith even when it is difficult and requires a change of plans. The Feast of the Epiphany is a good reminder to each of us to check our navigational system. What is it that provides me with motivation in life? What are the "stars" that I follow? And is Christ the "source and summit" of our journey.

Stewardship Reflection: The Light of the Moon

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."

If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.

Remember — the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.

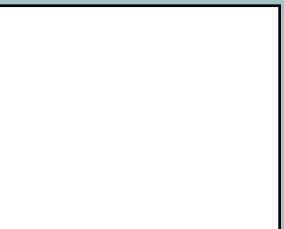

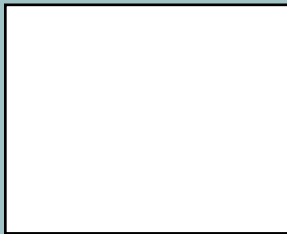

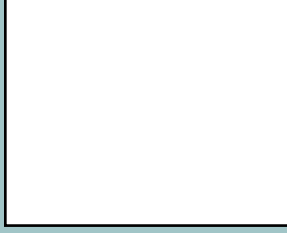
