

The Baptism of the Lord



From the Pastor

With this weekend's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we bring the Christmas Season to conclusion. In one of the earliest written records (around 100 AD) of the Christian Church called the *Didache*, we find instructions about baptism. "Baptize in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, in living water. But if you have not living water, baptize in other water. If you cannot baptize in cold, then in warm...pour water three times on the head." For nearly 2000 years we have been baptizing in exactly this manner.

Water is used to express cleansing from sin and a new birth to innocence and the Holy Spirit. In baptism we are joined to Christ and to the Church. A feast recalling the baptism of Jesus, invites us to consider once again the grace and blessing of our own baptism. Baptism marks a passage from death to life. The same water used to baptize is used to sprinkle on our caskets with the words: "In baptism we were joined to Christ, now may we come to share his Resurrection."

In our gospel passage this weekend, you will notice that there is a dove seen in the sky. To some that dove is representative of the dove that signaled the end to the great flood and a new beginning for Noah and his family. This event represents a new moment for the people of Israel. Jesus also speaks about another baptism into which he must be baptized and how great is his anguish until it is accomplished. Jesus will allow himself to be immersed in the baptism of suffering and death. Through these saving actions, all who believe and are baptized in him enter fully into his life and his death, and go with him through the passage of death to life everlasting.

So, what are we looking for? Ask yourself the question this week and give some thought to what your answer says. And consider this thought, "You can tell you are on the right tract...It is usually uphill.


Religious Education
