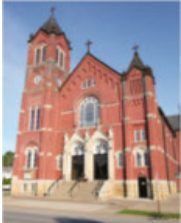

3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

*The Spirit of the Lord is upon me...
He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives
and recovery of sight to the blind,
to let the oppressed go free.
- Lk 4:18*

From the Pastor

The Scripture passages this weekend are truly life giving. In our First Reading from the Book of Nehemiah, we are told that the ancient Israelites hear the Word of God and they begin to weep, but then they are told instead to celebrate: "Go, eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks, for rejoicing in the Lord must be your strength." During this time, after their long absence from Jerusalem, they have now returned from Babylonian captivity and the priest Ezra reads to them from the Book of the Law. Perhaps the Israelites wept out of happiness or it could be that they did so out of sadness; we are not told of the cause of their weeping but the priest reminds them that the only days that they can control are today and the future, not yesterday. And so he tells them, "Do not dwell in the past! Rejoice for the Lord is with you today!"

In the Second Reading we hear the familiar Pauline message that we are "Christ's body, and individually parts of it!" But regardless of which part of Christ's body we are called to be, (you the hand, or me the little toe), we all have equal importance and are equally necessary for the Church--with Christ as the head of the body (or Church).

Then in the Gospel of Luke, we are presented with the scene of Jesus introducing his public ministry in the temple at Nazareth. He concludes his mission statement by saying, "Today these words are fulfilled in your hearing!" And all eyes in the synagogue looked intently at him.

These readings reveal to us much about our mission as Christian men and women. We gather together to worship; we live by civil law but more so by the law of God's love that brings liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind through the power of the Holy Spirit. We can see clearly that in accord with the teaching of St. Paul, we all have a part to play in building up the kingdom of God. We place our gifts at the service of the church and the community, and we demonstrate that by the sharing of our time, our talents, and our treasure. The US bishop's pastoral comments on stewardships sums this up for us nicely when it says, "Because its individual members do collectively make up the Body of Christ, that body's health and well-being are the responsibility of the members—the personal responsibility of each one of us. We are all stewards of the Church."


During the course of the next several weeks, I ask that we prayerfully consider how much of your time, talent and treasure is given to worldly things, and how much is truly and honestly given to God. How much effort do we put forth in building up the kingdom of God within ourselves, within the church, and within the community? And finally, how we may continue to be that supporting part of the body that follows the will of Christ, the head of that same body?

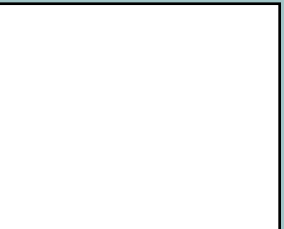

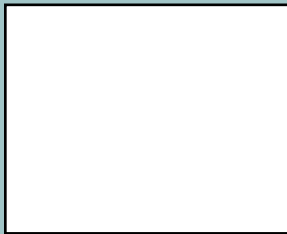

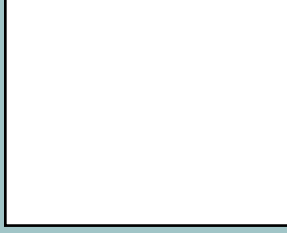
