From Fr. Steve

The 4th Sunday of Easter is traditionally known as "Good Shepherd" Sunday. On this Sunday, the gospel passage uses the image of Jesus as the good shepherd, and in this weekend's gospel Christ is revealed as the one who knows his sheep and his sheep follow him. "My sheep hear my voice and I give them eternal life. When Jesus used this image, all his listeners would have to do was survey the surrounding hill country to see the sheep with their shepherds.

This image also references a series of texts from the Hebrew Scriptures that described the relationship between God and God's people (cf. Ezekiel 34:29; Psalm 23; 80; Isaiah 40:11). Jesus is comparing his love for his contemporaries to God's gracious love. As was true for Paul and Barnabas in the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, only some are willing to listen and to follow.

We, too, hear a variety of voices in our lives. To whom do we listen? We may well listen to family, friends, neighbors, and to a variety of public figures. We may be influenced by advertising and social trends. We may desire to follow Christ but do we actually do so? Our choices may not turn us over to the devil but are they clear enough that others can see our commitment? You may recall that Jesus has little time for the lukewarm, for those he says he will "spit out of his mouth". It is the Good Shepherd who calls us to a loving and caring relationship. It is the Good Shepherd who leaves the 99 to go in search of the one. It is the Good Shepherd who raises the lost and wounded upon his shoulders. What greater security in love could we find than to listen to the voice of the Good Shepherd? "My sheep hear my voice." Do we?

Congratulation to all you Mothers on this special Mother's Day weekend! May you enjoy the love and respect of your children and may this year be a time of joy to you and your family.
