## THANK YOU LETTER FROM ST. HYACINTH

Dear Lumen Christi Community,

We the St. Hyacinth Community are blessed to have you as a sister parish. Your generous support has helped raise part of the replacement cost of St. Hyacinth's ailing roof. This will help ensure the continuity of our historic building which has served the south side since 1883.

Through our gathering together to socialize and pray, we have been able to have cultural exchanges while united under the banners of the Holy Roman Church and the American flag. For as the fathers of the Second Vatican Council wrote in 1964:

Thanks to you, we of the St. Hyacinth Congregation are greatly aided in maintaining a vibrant Catholic parish for years to come.

We hope to continue sharing our expressions of the faith well into the future. We cordially invite you to see the new roof upon completion. We can celebrate mass and revel in the Polish architectural and artistic legacy imbued in the St. Hyacinth Church which has been handed down to us Latinos.

#### **CREATION CARE CORNER RECOMMENDATION**

"... to defend the earth and to safeguard water is to protect life." — Pope Francis



**Plastic waste** is a huge and growing problem. Only 9% of the 9 billion tons of plastic produced has been recycled. There is very little demand for the plastic you do recycle. 40% of all plastic is designed to be used once and tossed. Plastic doesn't decompose easily and can last 100s of years. The waste clogs landfills and waterways, and poses hazards to animals and fish life. It breaks up into ever smaller microplastics getting into our air and food chain with unknown health effects.

#### What you can do:

- Say NO to single-use plastic. Carry your own cups, bags, to-go containers, utensils and forget the straws.
- Say NO to bottled water and pop. Carry refillables.
- Choose more biodegradable/recyclable materials like glass, paper, cardboard and metal instead of plastic... and then recycle those items.
- Avoid products with excessive packaging, excessive plastic packaging, and parts. If it leaves behind plastic trash, try not to buy it.

Recycle what you can't refuse, reduce or reuse.

## LIFELONG FORMATION

#### **DO YOU SPEAK STEWARDSHIP?**

f you are married, I'm guessing that you know the best way to break bad news to your spouse, whether you realize it or not. Maybe it's simply that you know not to talk about the budget after your wife's football team has lost. Maybe you know your husband will take the news that your sister is coming to stay a little easier if you tell him over his favorite dinner. We do the same thing with our children, our friends, our coworkers — we have all learned the language of the people we love.

The truth is the same in every language, but it's important for us to convey that truth graciously. That's what Pentecost teaches us. The gift of being able to speak in tongues afforded the Apostles a practical skill to spread the Gospel message, but it also served as a powerful symbol of the importance of effective communication. Evangelization can only happen when you're speaking in words a person is able, ready, and willing to hear.

Let's ask ourselves: what is the language we need to speak to share the truth with the person who is standing in front of

us? Is it the language of quality time? The language of concern? The language of laughter and friendship? The language of authenticity, of plain talk and frankness?


The Holy Spirit gave the Apostles the ability to speak in tongues, and it seems miraculous when we read about it in the Gospels — but only consider that we all have this same ability, in a certain way. The Holy Spirit can and will show us how to speak the truth, if we only ask.


