CORPUS CHRISTI WEEKEND RECAP

Last week we celebrated the feast of Corpus Christi (the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ) with extended Eucharistic Adoration time and special prayer opportunities that cumulated in Eucharistic processions after every weekend Mass.

We did this as the Church in the United States begins a three-year Eucharist Revival this month, to echo their "call and challenge for every Catholic across the United States to rekindle the fire of love and devotion for the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus."



CREATION CARE CORNER RECOMMENDATION

"...to defend the earth and to safeguard water is to protect life." — Pope Francis

How you use water can have a significant environmental impact over time. Low flow shower heads, washers, and dishwashers reduce water waste and can save you money, as does turning off the water while you're brushing your teeth or shaving. Fully load your washers and dishwashers before running. Got a leaky faucet or toilet? You might be wasting 200 gallons of water a day. Planning on outside watering? Check the forecast for rain.

Also, try drinking tap water instead of bottled water, to reduce packaging waste. The FDA says it's just as good for you. More water saving tips can be found at www.epa.gov/watersense.

STROKE SCREENINGS

Friday, July 1 | St. Mary Room Are you one of the many people that have high blood pressure, high cholesterol, or diabetes? Perhaps you have family history of heart disease, stroke, or internal cancers? If so, PLEASE do not miss the ultrasound screening



event that will take place here at Lumen Christi. Stroke Scan Plus will be hosting Vascular and Organ Wellness Ultrasound Screenings on Friday, July 1. These screenings are all done by ultrasound. There are no needles, blood draw, nor any disrobing necessary for these services.

The team will check the carotid arteries for blockages, the abdominal aorta for aneurysm, and will also scan several vital organs for stones, nodules, or any tumors that could be cancer.

Collectively, these screenings cost thousands in hospitals and are usually not covered by insurance providers unless a person is already having symptoms. Stroke Scan is offering these services to our parishioners for \$159 for all 7 tests combined. Insurance of any kind is not necessary to receive this discounted rate. **Pre-registration is required. You can either sign-up online via the parish website homepage button or in-person this weekend (June 25-26) at the welcome desk. More information is available on the parish website.**

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

God calls us in the midst of ordinary things. Often only looking for God in the dramatic, spectacular, the ritual or the sacred places, we miss that He is walking beside us. Every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling to us, "Follow me." Sometimes, we are too distracted to hear this call. Other times, we would rather ignore it or pretend it wasn't heard. God, however, is very persistent. Whether we fine tune our hearing to receive this invitation now or when we close our eyes in death, we need to make a choice. The choice involves leaving some things behind and moving forward, taking risks. Choosing to keep focused and single-minded, the lens we then use to see our world and one another is God's, not our own. Life is no



longer about what is important or matters to me but what matters to God. We acquire a new filter and are asked to use that filter to make choices, establish priorities, and determine what direction we will take, and how to love. Once we accept God's invitation, we cannot keep looking back to what was left behind, only forward to the surprises yet to come. ©LPi

SAINT OF THE WEEK – EXAMPLES OF OUR FAITH St. Oliver Plunkett | July 1

Saint Oliver Plunkett was the last Roman Catholic Martyr to die in England. He was canonized in 1975, the first new Irish saint in almost 700 years.

Oliver was born in Loughcrew, Oldcastle, County Meath in November 1625, the son of the Baron of Loughcrew. As a young man, he wanted to become a priest, but it was illegal to travel to the continent to enter seminary. Even so, he undertook the dangerous journey with four other young men and a Papal Envoy. They were pursued by English privateers, storms at sea, and robbers on land. However, Oliver entered Rome in 1647, and was admitted to the Irish College. He was an excellent student and was ordained on January 1,

1654. Oliver remained in Rome, studied law and served as chaplain at Spienza University, ministered at Santo Spirito hospital, and cared for the poor and ill. By 1657 he was a professor of Theology and later of Apologetics or Controversies at Propaganda College.

The 1650s were a difficult time in for Catholics in Ireland, the majority of population, as Cromwell passed many penal laws against them, and the practice of Catholicism was banned. During this time Oliver was appointed by Irish bishops to be their agent in Rome. Following the Restoration of Monarchy, Pope Clement IX appointed Oliver Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of all Ireland 1669. Oliver returned to a country where the Catholic Church was in disarray and divided. He had to travel largely incognito and perform his duties in makeshift locations. He is credited with unifying the Church and in traveling across the eleven dioceses under his purview, confirming thousands, and ordaining several priests.

In 1673 persecution of Catholics was again on the rise and bishops were banned. Oliver went into hiding, but in 1679 he was arrested and charged with treason. He was hanged, drawn, and quartered at Tyburn in July 1681. Before his death he publicly forgave those responsible. ©*LPi*


