COVID-19 UPDATES

On behalf of Fr. Tafadzwa and the parish staff: It is right and good to gather for worship. We are committed to creating a safe space to gather. Following the increase in COVID cases, and upon recommendation from the CDC and Green County Public Health, it is highly encouraged to wear masks indoors or where there are many people gathered to help mitigate the highly contagious Omicron variant.

Consider uniting the discomfort of masking with Christ's suffering as a prayerful offering.

The diocese is strongly encouraging the following three temporary preventative and mitigating measures:

- 1) Suspend the Sign of Peace.
- 2) Ministers of Holy Communion wear face masks during distribution of Holy Communion and sanitize their hands immediately prior.
- 3) Limit congregational singing.

St. Clare, in addition to these diocesan measures, is also running 5 commercial air purifiers in the church, sanitizing the church regularly, asking liturgical volunteers to wear a mask during their service at Mass, and encouraging hand sanitizing and staying home when you are sick or awaiting COVID test results.




