**Sacrament of Reconciliation:** Saturdays at 3:30-3:45 at St. John's or by appointment.



### September 26, 2021 A Reflection on the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

What are the little ones? They are the poor, the marginalized, the women and men at the well, the Zacchaeus' looking for Jesus from a tree, those mired in sin, the blind who want to see, and the lame who want to walk. They are the lepers and the different ones who have been told that they are unclean, and the ones who suffer from abuse and grave injustices and oppression. They are children who want nothing more than to be loved and enjoy celebrating their innocence. These are all the little ones and they are all vulnerable. Life already brings them burdens, we don't need to add to them.

St. Oscar Romero said, "When the church hears the cry of the oppressed it cannot but denounce the social structures that give rise to and perpetuate the misery from which the cry arises." Why are so many people still so gravely hurting? We have the resources and the means to make things better. We choose not to. There are still those things called greed, pride, lust, apathy, jealously, gluttony, and anger that prevent us from seeing each other and people to be loved and not objects to be used. Is this how God intended things to be?

God loves what is good and upright. It doesn't matter who did it or where it came from. In God's eyes, the end result is always faith, hope, and love. Those will always unite a person with God. We fill our lives with many things that are not good either for ourselves or for others. All of us have to work to discover what it is, exactly, that leads to the world's brokenness. There are people, systems, and ideologies in place that foster oppression and injustice rather than equity and fairness. Sadly, our complacency can be the greatest evil. Turning a blind eye, ignoring the truth, and believing that we are helpless to fix so great a problem, does little to move us closer to the kingdom of God. As members of the Body of Christ, we cannot condone anything that keeps people in misery.

As it is said, charity begins at home. Perhaps a good place to start is with our own households and making sure their foundations are properly laid.

Am I Over the Hill Or. . . . . .

I've been asking myself a lot of questions lately. During the Covid 19 season a year ago I was seriously thinking of calling it quits. But then I got a second wind. I did not expect to live to be 80 and here I am at 83! Is it time to move to St. Fidelis? (Our retirement home.) Can I teach myself to sleep until 7:30, or 6:30 or even 6:00 AM? At present, I always wake up around 4:30. Isn't that stupid? I thought as I grew older I would get more sense. Even my doctor asked me recently, "When are you going to retire"! I told him that I am retired. I say Mass for people because I enjoy doing it, and preparing a homily several times a week helps me keep my brain working . . . . . I think.

It wasn't long ago that I always seemed to be the youngest friar in a group. I know because I always seemed to have to take the notes! Then I suddenly – about 10 years ago – became one of the "oldsters." Then they would look to me to run the meeting. What happened to that "In-between" time? Somehow, I missed that time – or maybe it missed me. I think it has something to do with the saying, "The older I get the faster time goes." Did you know that by the time you read this there will only be about 88 days to Christmas? I have not been out shopping. Are the Christmas decorations up?

Last night I was thinking about my Graduating Class from St. Cloud grade School. I knew there were 18 of us, 6 girls and 12 boys. I started writing down the names. I got – you guessed it – seventeen names. Who was I missing? I kept wondering for about a half hour. I even went for a little walk. That's another gift of old age, we forget. I always say that God gave us this gift, so we would get the exercise we need. How many times do I come up to my bedroom and then ask myself, "Why did I come up here? What am I looking for?" Anyway, I finally thought of my last classmate. He was obviously one of the first I should have thought of!

Then I made two columns: "Living" and "Deceased." It turns out that there are nine of each. Two girls and seven boys have died. That reminded me again that I have reached the peak and from here on it is all downhill!



Thinking about these things made me a little sentimental. I suddenly

found myself digging through a whole box of pictures I hadn't looked at since I left St. Joe's in Appleton. Wow! There were some winners there. I found myself laughing all by myself. I went to bed with many happy memories.

This morning one of the first things I was greeted with was, "I think you should update your power of attorney papers for health care." The last ones I did were about ten years ago. The two people I chose with power over my life are still alive and well. I think I will re-do them just as they were and put a new date on them. That will make everything good. I did my funeral plans a couple months ago. So, I should be all set.

Now what? I keep running down that hill but I keep putting the brakes on. It's time to start living again. Saying Mass and preaching **short** homilies. Until you tell me otherwise. .!

#### **Breaking the Stewardship Mold**

Have you noticed how we always tend to pigeonhole one another — and ourselves? "I could never serve on the Parish Council. That's for Rick and Ellen and that whole group of people who have done it for years." "Greg takes care of faith formation in the parish — he always has. He doesn't need my help." "I can't afford to give the big bucks like those families who sit up front can. My offering wouldn't matter even if I did increase it."


Thinking like this is a good indication that we aren't in conversation with God about what His will is for our lives. If we have already decided what we are and are not meant to do, we aren't likely to pray over it, to discern it.

We have to be open to the spirit of the Lord wherever it leads us, regardless of what we or others have come to expect from us. We human beings come to believe that we are such good judges of what others can offer — or what we ourselves can offer. But God has plans for us to which we aren't privy. God calls everyone to serve Him in the way that pleases Him best, and only He can decide what that is. Everyday Stewardship demands a continual accounting of who we can be, what we can offer — even if it's outside our comfort zone, even if it's something that never occurred to us before.

There's only one Person who can tell us what God wants from us. Do we even think to ask Him?
