From the Pastor's Desk

Dear parishioners,

Happy Season of Ordinary Time! Ordinary Time sounds, shall we say, "ordinary". As we move from the Christmas season, let us by God's grace carry the peace and light of the Prince of Peace in our hearts throughout the year.

Holy Church celebrates the saving work of Christ on prescribed days over the year with sacred remembrance. Each week, on the day called the Lord's Day, she commemorates the Resurrection of the Lord, which she also celebrates once a year in the great Paschal Solemnity, together with His blessed Passion. In fact, throughout the course of the year the Church unfolds the entire mystery of Christ and observes the birthdays of the Saints. (Sacrosanctum concilium from Second Vatican Council Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy)

As we begin the liturgical season of Ordinary Time, it might be helpful to remind ourselves of the Church's liturgical year and particular seasons. I'm sure for some of you this sound as interesting as watching paint dry. However, the liturgical life of the Church is full of graces and joys! At the heart of it, we reflect on the life of Christ and His love for us and the Church. The Church's liturgical year is separated into six seasons, which draw us into the life, mission, Passion, Death, and glorious Resurrection of Jesus. We also share in the life of the saints of the Church throughout the year. Here is a breakdown of the seasons:

ADVENT - The four weeks of preparation before the celebration of Jesus' birth.

CHRISTMAS - Recalling the Nativity of Jesus Christ and His manifestation (**EPIPHANY**) to the peoples of the world.

LENT - A six-week period of penance before Easter, beginning with Ash Wednesday.

SACRED TRIDUUM - The holiest *three days* of the Church's year, when the Christian people recall the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

EASTER - 50 days of joyful celebration of the Lord's Resurrection from the dead and His sending forth of the Holy Spirit (**PENTECOST**).

ORDINARY TIME - Divided into two sections (one span from 4-8 weeks beginning after the Christmas season, the section we find ourselves in now, and the another lasting six months after the season of Easter).

Along with the setting of the liturgical year, there's also the liturgical calendar, which prescribes saints to celebrate for a community. In the Archdiocese of Saint Louis, we have unique celebrations of saints with different solemnities than other dioceses; Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne, Saint Vincent de Paul, and Saint Louis are all saints with a connection to our faith community here in the Archdiocese. And with Saint Anselm Parish being associated with Benedictine monks, we have the unique

opportunity to honor some of the saints of the Benedictine tradition, like Saint Benet Biscop, who we celebrated this week.

January marks the month of the Supreme Court decision of Roe v. Wade, the case that legalized abortion on demand. This month, many across the country will make a pilgrimage to our nation's capital to pray for and witness to the Culture of Life. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has published a novena to pray from January 19-27, which you can find at www.respectlife. ora/9-days-signup.

An update on our observance of masking and social distancing at Mass: As we continue to see a rise in the omicron variant, I wanted to remind everyone to be calm but vigilant. We seem to be doing well with our current masking protocol for Mass, which is that masks are recommended and encouraged. I trust you all will use good judgement in the choices you make in staying healthy. We might, in the next few weeks, be mindful of where we sit at Mass (in other words, trying to spread out more in the church when choosing our seats). As always, if you're not feeling well, please stay home. We love you and want you to come pray with us; however, we also want you to take care of yourself as well.

Thank you for your patience, and as Padre Pio says: **Pray**, **Hope**, and **Don't Worry**.

Saint Antony entered into monastic life when he heard the Gospel of Jesus telling the rich young man to sell what he had and follow Him. Many followed Antony and lived as monks under his spiritual guidance. His biography by Saint Athanasius was the first Christian "best seller", and his struggles against supernatural temptation inspired countless works of Christian art.

feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul on Jan 25, we pray
for the reunion of the many Christian churches into the
one Church, that all may be one.

Jan. 21 – Saint Agnes, virgin & martyr (291-304)
Agnes vowed her heart and purity to God at a young age. One of her many suitors denounced her to authorities as a Christian, yet every attempt to make deny her faith failed. "I would offend my Spouse," she said, "if I were to try to please you. He chose me first and He shall have me!" She accepted her sentence of beheading with the joy of a bride on her wedding day.



Hanging with the Saints

Who is Saint André Bessette?



The Congregation of the Holy Cross was skeptical when Alfred Bessette asked to enter the novitiate. The young man was nearly illiterate, and chronic illness left him unfit for hard work. But he held a note from his pastor that read: "I am sending you a saint."

Alfred took the name "André", and was assigned the role of doorkeeper at the college. He later joked, "At the end

of my novitiate, my superiors showed me the door, and I stayed there for forty years." His duties were small and unimportant in most people's eyes - greet visitors, wake the boys for class, deliver mail - but Br. André did everything joyfully, never complaining of his illness or weariness.

Many visitors asked him to pray for their health, and he often visited the sick with a medal of St. Joseph, urging them to trust completely in the Lord. Word soon spread of miraculous healings, but the monk insisted the glory belonged to God and St. Joseph - all he had done was pray.

With his superiors' permission, Br. André built a tiny shrine to St. Joseph. Visitors began to donate and within ten years, the shrine had grown exponentially, tens of thousands of letters pouring in weekly asking Br. André to pray for them. At his death in 1937 at the age of 91, millions of people traveled to file past his coffin and pay their respects.

Because Saint André saw himself as one of the "smallest brushes" in the Artist's hand, humbly offering all he was to God, God was able to work wonders through him. What can we take to prayer and offer to God, clearing the way for Him to create something beautiful through us?




