

Faith Formation Corner

When we go to Mass on Sunday, how often do we prepare ourselves for what we are going to receive? We should remember to go to confession before Mass so that we are in the state of grace to receive our Lord, but do we also prepare our hearts and minds to receive His word as well? Lectio Divina is a way to pray with scripture. I greatly encourage you to look it up and try it if you have never tried it before. Christ teaches us through prayer and through scripture and as adults we don't like to be vulnerable because we are afraid of what Jesus might tell us. But if we are childlike, we are excited to hear what He has to say - because Jesus doesn't teach us in a way that we are used to. When we pray through Lectio Divina, and though His word, He teaches.....and He loves. He doesn't take things quickly, but at our own pace.

Even if the lesson He wants to teach us is hard because we've messed up or because we need to change our ways, we don't feel horrible when Jesus teaches because He lets us know that we are still loved. I know we all want to be better people, we want to be the ones to bring Christ's light into the world, but in order to do that, we have to be ok with letting others help us, and letting others love us, just as we desire to help and love others.

His lessons are reminders to us that we are not our own. When we don't want to ask for help and we think we can do it all ourselves, we need to remember that we are not alone - we are His. You are a daughter, you are a son of God and He loves you. He cares for you - don't be afraid to ask for His help in even the smallest things. You are not alone.



The answer is yes, but there are only a limited number of spaces still available for purchase at that cemetery. A columbarium was added two years ago to add additional space for cremated remains.
