

The Light of the Moon

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."



If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from chlldhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.

Remember — the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.

El hecho de que tengamos el honor de llevarlo a cabo en su nombre es un hermoso regalo. Es Dios quien hace que nuestras vidas ordinarias sean extraordinarias.

Al final de la película, George Bailey se da cuenta de que tuvo una vida mucho mejor porque, en lugar de ser el héroe de su propia historia, se permitió reflejar la bondad en los demás.

It's bigger than Christmas in some countries. Epiphany is the day in many cultures where the birth of Christ is celebrated and gifts are exchanged. Traditionally, the Feast of the Epiphany is celebrated on January 6. With a longer Advent in 2021, Christmas was celebrated on a Friday, the feast of Holy Family was on Sunday the 26th, and the Epiphany is on January 2. With all of this, I find myself a bit "off" the regular schedule.

A few years ago, in early January, I had the opportunity to spend time at the Shrine of our Lady of Guadalupe, in Mexico City. I arrived in Mexico a few days before the Feast of the Epiphany. On the Feast itself, I was downtown with some of my priest classmates and we were amazed at the size of the crowds. There were thousands of people! Most gathered as "families." I was inspired by moms, dads, and children coming together to celebrate Christmas as family. It was inspirational!!

The word Epiphany comes from the word, "manifestation." Christ is made manifest to the world not only to one group of people, but for all "people of good will."

The Magi who visited Jesus are also referred to as the Wise Men or Kings. The Three Magi were distinguished foreigners in the Gospel of Matthew and Christian tradition. Tradition has them visiting Jesus after his birth, bearing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. They were not "local folks," but people like us who now share in the promise of redemption by God's Son. We are proud to be part of the inheritance.

I encourage you to make that inheritance visible in your home by using the Epiphany Door Blessing, as we do in our Churches today. We ask God's blessing on our families and all who enter through the blessed doors.

We've been through a lot these past few years. There have been joys and sorrows, but because of Jesus' promise of hope and new life, we share in the "Springs of Hope" that are visible in Waukesha. We manifest that hope to all our visitors this year!

Pudieramos decir que la Fiesta de la Epifanía llega a ser mas grande que la misma Navidad en algunos países. Suele intercambiarse regalos en la Epifanía en muchos países donde se celebra el nacimiento de Cristo. Esta fiesta es celebrada cada 6 de enero. En este 2021 hemos tenido un tiempo de Adviento largo, la Navidad la celebramos un viernes, la Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia fue domingo 26 de diciembre, la Epifanía el 2 de enero. Todas estas celebraciones juntas me hacen sentir "fuera" de tiempo.

Fueron para mi una inspiración las madres, los padres y los niños, todos unidos para celebrar la navidad en familia. ¡Fue inspirador!.

La palabra Epifanía proviene de la palabra "manifestación". Cristo se manifiesta al mundo, no solo a un grupo de personas, sino a todas las "personas de buena voluntad".

Los magos que visitaron a Jesús también se conocen como los sabios o los reyes. Los Tres Magos fueron extranjeros distinguidos en el Evangelio de Mateo y la tradición cristiana. La tradición los hace visitar a Jesús después de su nacimiento, llevando obsequios de oro, incienso y mirra. No eran "lugareños", sino personas como nosotros que ahora comparten la promesa de redención del Hijo de Dios. Estamos orgullosos de ser parte de esta herencia.

Quiero animarles a tener presente esta herencia en su hogar mediante el uso de la Bendición de la Puerta de la Epifanía, como lo hacemos en nuestras iglesias hoy. Pedimos la bendición de Dios para nuestras familias y todos los que entran por las puertas bendecidas.




Sunday, January 2, 2022 Overjoyed

Today's readings: Isaiah 60:1–6; Psalm 72:1–2, 7–8, 10–11, 12-13; Ephesians 3:2–3a, 5–6; Matthew 2:1–12. "They were overjoyed at seeing the star." The Magi had gone to the palace because their way of seeking wisdom—following the natural signs of the world—told them a king had been born. A king whose importance was so great that his birth was told in the stars. But the king was not in the palace. This birth, so significant as to be marked by a star, was hidden away in Bethlehem, a small town.

The Magi were not Jewish. They did not know about the promise of God that was now being fulfilled. But God gave them a light to follow. The new thing that God was doing—fulfilling the promises of old to bring salvation to the ends of the earth—included them. Scripture tells us that when the star stopped over the place where Jesus was, the Magi were overjoyed to see it. Inside the home, they found Jesus with Mary, his mother. They fell down and worshiped him, so overcome were they with joy at what God was doing and at the gift of being allowed to share in it.

Then the Magi went home by another route. This is, of course, practical, in that they were avoiding Herod. But they went home a different way because they were themselves different. They were changed by their joy. What light has God given you to follow? When have you been filled with joy? How did it change you?

Domingo, 2 de enero de 2022 Exultante

Lecturas del día: Isaías 60:1–6; Salmo 72:1–2, 7–8, 10–11, 12–13; Efesios 3:2–3a, 5–6; Mateo 2:1–12. "Al ver la estrella, se llenaron de una inmensa alegría". Los Reyes Magos fueron al palacio porque su manera de buscar la sabiduría, rastreando los signos naturales del mundo, les decía que había nacido un rey. Un rey tan importante que su nacimiento lo contaban las estrellas; un rey que no estaba en el palacio. Este nacimiento, ¡señalado por una estrella!, estaba escondido en una ciudad pequeña: Belén.

Los Magos no eran judíos. Nada sabían de la promesa que Dios estaba cumpliendo. Pero Dios les dio una luz a seguir. Lo nuevo que Dios estaba realizando —cumplir las promesas de llevar la salvación hasta los confines de la tierra— los incluía a ellos.

Al detenerse la estrella sobre donde estaba Jesús, la Escritura nos dice que los Magos se alegraron mucho de verla. En la casa encontraron a Jesús con María, su madre; se postraron y lo adoraron, exultantes de gozo por lo que Dios estaba realizando y por el don de participar en ello.

Según la Escritura, los Magos volvieron a casa por otra ruta, para evitar a Herodes. Pero también volvieron a casa transformados de alegría. ¿Qué luz le ha dado Dios a usted para seguirla? ¿Cuándo se ha sentido usted lleno de alegría inmensa? ¿Cómo se transformó usted?

Bless Your Door on Epiphany



The gospel tells us that the magi found Christ "on entering the house." the door to your home is a holy threshold. You can bless those who come in and go out by inscribing above the door in chalk the first two numbers of the year+C+M+B+ the last two numbers of the year (20+C+M+B+22). Tradition tells us that the letters stand for the names of the magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. Adolph Adam points out that it may also mean "Christus mansionem benedicat" or "May Christ bless this dwelling." It's appropriate to bless your door in January – janua mean "door" and the first month is the door to the new year. Chalk is available at the parish.

After inscribing the doorway, say this prayer:

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. R/. Amen. The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying: May Christ Jesus dwell with us, keep us from all harm, and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever. 
