Thinking about Love

When a man and a woman come to the Church for a wedding it is a blessed day because they are coming to the fountain of love, to celebrate their matrimony (which is the base in a covenantal relationship). This covenant implies that both man and woman have rights and duties for life. In the desire to make a covenant, both are present at the Church with a free aspiration to exchange their consent where a man gives and accepts a woman, and a woman gives and accepts a man. This is done through an irrevocable promise of mutual love which implies that they give themselves completely to one another.

They freely choose to give and receive one another to form one life together. A man and a woman were created for each other, and that complementarity is based on a self-donation love. Thus, the couple opted for a common life- a project for life. Does it sound difficult? Yes. It is difficult when it depends only on human effort and will. But Jesus is inviting you to live this wonderful project of life without fear or insecurities, but with the illusion and joy that God is an integrated part in the marriage. He wants you to live by love, in love and with love. Marriage is a vocation of love because God is calling you to existence through love, and for love. Thus, the love between a married couple is the fundamental and innate vocation for one another. So, the meaning of your lives is found in giving and receiving love because the desire is imprinted in your hearts by God.

God emphasizes in his love, the unity of marriage: two who become one. The Word of God implies that this love is a sign of love between Christ and the Church- an indissoluble love of self-donation. This is the affirmation of marriage as the lifelong joining of two persons in a profound union: one flesh. It is a covenantal love which creates a perpetual and exclusive bond between the spouses. This bond is indissoluble, lifelong, and presupposes and demands the unity of the couple, which is a gift of God's creation. God recalls his original intent for marriage, to be integrated into your marriage. If you are united to the fountain of love your marriage will always be blessed based on mutual love. If your marriage is united with God, you are cooperators in God's design of marriage and are cooperating with the creator in giving life. Is it not beautiful?

Jesus invites and encourages spouses to live in fidelity which symbolizes the fidelity to God, and God's fidelity to you. God is inviting the spouses to live in marriage as one, which is a process of growth; not only in your relationship, but also as a communion of persons committed to love, life, the betterment of society, and the mission of the Church.

In fact, the nature of the authentic personal love of the spouse demands permanence, continuity, fidelity, and perseverance in a conjugal communion of love. This means that God is present in the stability and communion of love. In the current society this can be translated as a stable union that provides education, common life, human support, and love to one another. This stability and conjugal communion of love is a sign of respect, dedication, affection, and it promotes the constant search for the common good. This implies a willingness to forgive, help, and support one another in all circumstance. Such as, adversity and prosperity, and in sickness and health. Marriage should be based in the love of God that leads you both to grow old together, with the blessing and help of God. If you are not married by the Church, come, and get married today. God is inviting and waiting for you both. Marriage is a vocation of love.

Pensando en el Amor

Cuando un hombre y una mujer vienen a la Iglesia para la Boda, es un día bendecido porque vienen a la Iglesia, que es la fuente del amor, para celebrar su matrimonio el cual se basa en una relación de alianza. Jesús invita y anima a los esposos a vivir en la fidelidad que simboliza al mismo tiempo la fidelidad a Dios y la fidelidad de Dios hacia vosotros. Dios invita a los esposos a vivir juntos en matrimonio como uno solo, lo cual es un proceso de crecimiento no solo en su relación, sino esencialmente como una comunión de personas comprometidas con el amor, la vida, el mejoramiento de la sociedad y la misión de la Iglesia.

En efecto, la naturaleza del auténtico amor personal del cónyuge exige permanencia, continuidad, fidelidad y perseverancia en una comunión conyugal de amor. Esto quiere decir que Dios se enfatiza en la estabilidad y comunión conyugal de amor que en la sociedad actual se puede traducir como una unión estable que brinda educación, convivencia, apoyo humano y amor mutuo. Esta estabilidad y comunión conyugal de amor en el matrimonio es signo de respeto, entrega y afecto, y promueve la búsqueda constante del bien común, implica la voluntad de perdonarse, ayudarse y apoyarse mutuamente en las circunstancias, en las adversidades y prosperidad, en la enfermedad y en la salud. El matrimonio debe basarse en el amor de Dios, en el amor que los lleva a ambos a envejecer amorosamente con la bendición y ayuda de Dios, que acompaña vuestro camino matrimonial. Si no estas casado por la Iglesia, ven y cástate hoy porque Dios los está invitando y esperando a los dos. El matrimonio es una vocación de amor.

Gospel Meditation

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

God delights in you. How do you feel when you hear that? Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. It is okay to celebrate the wonder of ourselves and others. Life is good. It is always interesting to note that Jesus saves the good wine until last. You would think it would be the other way around. The superb quality of Jesus' wine points to the superior quality of life we find in Christ. It is not a life of burdens but a life of wonder and delight! In Christ, we are lifted from the superficial and mundane to a life of purpose, hope, and love.

God is with us through the long haul, through the challenges and sorrows as well as the successes and accomplishments. In spite of the fact that we often wander from the path, God's celebratory delight in us remains. As spouses are asked to remain faithful to each other through whatever life brings, God remains faithful too. This promise remains through this life and into the next. All we have to do is take the advice of Jesus' mother to heart when she says, "Listen to him." This wisdom saves us from foolishly giving in to the illusion that we can make better wine than Jesus.

Meditación del Evangelio

2º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Con la fiesta de la Epifanía y el Bautismo del Señor se cierra el Tiempo de Navidad, que siempre es precedido por el Adviento. Ahora, comenzamos el Tiempo Ordinario. Serán siete domingos de este corto periodo, que termina el día anterior al Miércoles de Ceniza. La segunda etapa de este Tiempo es más larga, da comienzo después del domingo de Pentecostés y termina hasta el sábado antes del primer domingo de Adviento. ¿Para qué sirve a los cristianos este Tiempo Ordinario? ¿Qué nos pide la Liturgia de este tiempo? Pues, es muy sencillo, nos pide meditar en el misterio de Cristo. En su invitación de participar en su Reino con alegría y compromiso verdadero. La Iglesia tiene diversidad de carismas, donde podemos entregarnos al servicio de los demás.

"Alegrémonos, regocijémonos démosle honor y gloria, porque han llegado las bodas del Cordero" (Apocalipsis 19,7). También, el profeta en la primera lectura lo pone claro: "No te llamen más 'Abandonada', ni a tu tierra 'Desolada', sino que te llamen 'Mi Preferida' y a tu tierra 'Desposada'. Porque Yavé se complacerá en ti y tu tierra tendrá un esposo" (Isaías 62,4).


