MANANTIALES DE ESPERANZA

Is there such a thing as a stewardship of recreation? Some people might dismiss the thought. But they'd be wrong.

In his book, *The Gift of the Jews*, author Thomas Cahill observes that, in receiving the Ten Commandments, the ancient Hebrews did something no other ancient society had ever done: they established a day of rest. "The God who made the universe and rested bids us to do the same, calling us to a weekly restoration of prayer, study, and recreation (or re-creation)."

For those of us in the Northern Hemisphere at least, probably no other month bids us to relax as the month of July does. Backyard barbecues, days at the pool or the beach, a recreational outing or simply the lazy idleness of a mid-year Sunday afternoon invite us to slow down. And this invitation should be heeded. Sometimes, our society induces in us a sense of guilt if we're not "doing." But turning off the computer and the phone and spending quality time with those around us, or finding time for our own interior lives, is stewardship of our time which leads to the place where God dwells. It's a good example for our kids as well: July presents a wonderful time to "rest" from all the electronic screens and busyness that dominate their young lives.

July is also the month when U.S. citizens celebrate the proclamation of their freedom. When the Hebrew people first received the Ten Commandments, they too had just received their freedom from the Egyptians after a sojourn in the wilderness. Cahill thinks it's no coincidence that a people recently liberated were in need of a directive to rest and reflect. "Leisure," he writes, "is the necessary ground of creativity, and a free people are free to imitate the creativity of God."

So, the next time you feel guilty about a quiet, reflective time of doing "nothing," remember that recreation also means "re-creation." To be a truly creative person, a steward of our interior resources, we must honor our need to rest, relax, be with others, read and play. ¿Existe tal cosa como una corresponsabilidad de la recreación? Algunas personas pudiesen descartar esta idea, pero se estarían equivocando.

En su libro, "El regalo de los judíos", el autor Thomas Cahill observa que, al recibir los Diez Mandamientos, los antiguos hebreos hicieron algo que ninguna otra sociedad antigua había hecho jamás: establecieron un día de descanso. "El Dios que hizo el universo y descansó nos pide que hagamos lo mismo, llamándonos a una restauración semanal de oración, estudio y recreación (o recreación)".

Para nosotros que provenimos del hemisferio norte al menos, probablemente ningún otro mes nos invita a relajarnos como lo hace el mes de julio. Las parrilladas en el patio, los días de piscina o playa, una salida recreativa o simplemente una tarde de domingo de mitad de año nos invitan a bajar el ritmo. Y esta invitación debe ser atendida. A veces, nuestra sociedad induce en nosotros un sentimiento de culpa si no estamos "haciendo algo". Pero apagar la computadora y el teléfono y pasar tiempo de calidad con quienes nos rodean, o encontrar tiempo para nuestra propia vida interior, es una corresponsabilidad de nuestro tiempo que nos lleva al lugar donde mora Dios. También es un buen ejemplo para nuestros hijos: julio presenta un momento maravilloso para "descansar" de todas las pantallas electrónicas y el trabajo que domina sus jóvenes vidas.

Julio es también el mes en que los ciudadanos estadounidenses celebran la proclamación de su libertad. Cuando el pueblo hebreo recibió por primera vez los Diez Mandamientos, ellos también acababan de recibir su libertad de los egipcios después de una estancia en el desierto. Cahill cree que no es coincidencia que un pueblo recién liberado necesitara un mandamiento para descansar y reflexionar. "El ocio", escribe, "es la base necesaria de la creatividad, y un pueblo libre es libre de imitar la creatividad de Dios".

Entonces, la próxima vez que se sienta culpable por un momento tranquilo y reflexivo de no hacer "nada", recuerde que la recreación también significa "re-crear". Para ser una persona verdaderamente creativa, administradora de nuestros recursos interiores, debemos honrar nuestra necesidad de descansar, relajarnos, estar con los demás, leer y jugar. 




St. Josemaria Escriva | Catholic Saints

The Eucharistic Revival / El Avivamiento Eucarístico

What happens when we receive the Eucharist?



We have the opportunity to receive communion every time we participate in Mass. We approach, we receive, and we go back to our pew. Do we appreciate what just happened? Do we know what we received? Do we understand the implications of what we have just done? Do we even know what the church teaches about Eucharist?

Back in 2019, there was a Pew study done which revealed that only 31% of Catholics know and believe in the Eucharist. This is a shocking number. However, if even one person who professes themselves Catholic doesn't know or believe what the Church teaches on this central teaching of our faith it is too many.

The bishops saw these results and responded by saying we need a revival. We need a time for healing, formation, conversion, and unification. This only became more evident through and after the pandemic. Many people were clamoring for a return to receive communion while others just have not found their way back. Why?

Our society is broken and people are looking for ways to fill a need/a longing. We need healing and so many are looking in the wrong places/destructive places not understanding that Jesus/God is ultimately the only place to fill that longing. While there are many places where we can find God, our easiest, most tangible way is Eucharist, and the Real Presence found in the Blessed Sacrament. The Church as the Body of Christ should be a place for healing. Do we Catholics understand this? Have we felt/experienced that healing?

Do we know who we are as Catholics? Pope Benedict XVI said in Deus Caritas, "Being Christian is not a result of an ethical choice or a lofty ideal. It is a fruit of an encounter with a person." Do we know that what we receive is the person of Christ and encounter with the living God? Our very identity comes from this encounter/this relationship. Until we really learn who we are in this identity, we will not be able to go out and draw other in. What is your identity? Where do you get your identity? Do we identify with this Eucharistic Encounter?

If Eucharist and the Mass is the source and summit, of who we are and from where we come and go, then we need to understand all this better.

It is with all this in mind that we invite you, this community, to dive in and join in this pilgrimage to revive our belief in Eucharist, to go deeper in our formation and understanding, to open ourselves up to Eucharistic encounters with God, and to reinvigorate our devotion, prayer, and worship.

Do you want more? Join us and/or search for and share what you find that sparks your fire within. Join the EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL!

¿Qué sucede cuando recibimos la Eucaristía?

Tenemos la oportunidad de recibir la comunión cada vez que participamos en la Misa. Nos acercamos, recibimos y volvemos a nuestra banca. ¿Apreciamos lo que acaba de pasar? ¿Sabemos lo que recibimos? ¿Entendemos las implicaciones de lo que acabamos de hacer? ¿Sabemos lo que la Iglesia enseña acerca de la Eucaristía?

En 2019, se realizó un estudio que reveló que solo el 31% de los católicos conocen y creen en la Eucaristía. Es una cifra que impacta. Si consideramos que una sola persona que se profesa así misma católica no sabe o no cree lo que la Iglesia enseña sobre esta enseñanza primordial de lo que es nuestra fe, ya de por si estamos ante un problema muy grande.

Los obispos al observar estos resultados, respondieron diciendo: "necesitamos un avivamiento". Necesitamos un tiempo de sanación, formación, conversión y unificación. Esto solo se hizo más evidente durante y después de la pandemia. Muchas personas clamaban por volver a recibir la comunión, mientras que otras simplemente no han encontrado el camino de regreso. ¿Por qué?

Nuestra sociedad está herida y la gente está buscando formas de satisfacer una necesidad/un anhelo. Necesitamos sanación y muchos están buscando en los lugares equivocados/lugares destructivos sin entender que Jesús/Dios es el único lugar para llenar ese anhelo. Si bien hay muchos lugares donde podemos encontrar a Dios, nuestra forma más fácil y tangible es la Eucaristía y la Presencia Real que se encuentra en el Santísimo Sacramento. La Iglesia como Cuerpo de Cristo debe ser un lugar de sanación. ¿Los católicos entendemos esto? ¿Hemos sentido/experimentado esa sanación?

¿Sabemos quiénes somos como católicos? El Papa Benedicto XVI dijo en Deus Caritas: "Ser cristiano no es el resultado de una elección ética o un ideal elevado. Es fruto de un encuentro con una persona". ¿Sabemos que lo que recibimos es la persona de Cristo y el encuentro con el Dios vivo? Nuestra propia identidad proviene de este encuentro/esta relación. Hasta que realmente aprendamos quiénes somos en esta identidad, no seremos capaces de salir y atraer a otros. ¿Cuál es tu identidad? ¿De dónde sacas tu identidad? ¿Nos identificamos con este Encuentro Eucarístico?

Si la Eucaristía y la Misa son la fuente y la cumbre, de quiénes somos y de dónde venimos y a donde vamos, entonces necesitamos entender todo esto mejor.

Habiendo dicho todo esto, queremos invitarlos como comunidad, a sumergirse y unirse a esta peregrinación para revivir nuestra creencia en la Eucaristía, profundizar en nuestra formación y comprensión, abrirnos a los encuentros eucarísticos con Dios, para revitalizar nuestra devoción, oración y adoración.



Trustee Nominations

Wisconsin law requires that every parish have two trustees, each serving a two-year term. They must be Catholics who are registered, practicing members of the parish and at least 25 years of age. The parishioners who are at least 18 years of age elect a trustee. One trustee position at St. Mary has become open this fiscal year.

Fr. Matthew Widder has nominated Jason Pechloff to fill the position of Trustee at St. Mary Parish, taking the place of Beth Polacheck. Fr. Matthew Widder has also nominated Michael Bassi to continue to serve an additional two-year term as Trustee at St. William Parish, Robin Wiedenhoeft to serve an additional two-year term as Trustee at St. John Neumann Parish, and Fidel Jaramillo to serve an additional two-year term as Trustee at St. Joseph Parish.

Additional qualified candidates can also be nominated by submitting a written nomination signed by 10 or more registered parishioners. All written nominations must be given to Nick Sanders at St. William Parish, by Noon on Friday, July 14, 2023. If there is a candidate who submits ten signatures by July 14, 2023, an election will be held between that candidate and the candidate nominated by Fr. Matthew on the weekend of August 5-6. A nomination/signature can be requested from the finance office at St. William.

A huge thanks to those who have served our parishes as trustees over the years, and a big thanks to those who have accepted nominations for this important leadership role within our community.
