

Reflection In today’s gospel it seems that Jesus is choosing teams. They are not chosen because of talent or personality, power, or prestige, but by what they have done with their lives. What have they done for others? On one team are those chosen to inherit the kingdom. They are those who fed the hungry, gave drink to the thirsty, welcomed the stranger, clothed the naked, cared for the ill, and visited the imprisoned. On the other team are those who will receive eternal punishment. They are the ones who ignored the needs of others. They were concerned only about self.

Today we celebrate Christ the King of the Universe. His kingdom is not concerned with property, wealth, or boundaries; it is a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love, and peace. We consider our own desire to be part of that eternal kingdom. I suspect that all of us would say we pray that one day we will be in heaven and part of God’s eternal kingdom.

So how do I need to live in order to inherit the eternal kingdom of God. The checklist that we can follow to evaluate our own life is the one given in the Gospel. Am I one who: feeds the hungry, gives drink to the thirsty, welcomes the stranger, clothes the naked, cares for the ill, visits the imprisoned?

God wants us all on the team chosen to inherit the kingdom. Recall the words of the first reading (Ezekiel) in which we hear of a good shepherd who will “look after and tend the sheep he will rescue them from every place where they were scattered ... he will pasture the sheep; he will give them rest ... he will seek out the strayed ... bind up the injured, heal the sick, shepherding them rightly.

As this church year concludes, let us call upon God’s grace to be his faithful flock, reflected in our care and concern for others, especially those most in need. Let him be our good shepherd who guides us along the way. *Fr. Tom*

I'm sure that it saddens us all, not to be connected with family and friends as in the past. It is important for us to become more deliberate in contemplating all for which we should be grateful.

One of the central aspects of stewardship is gratitude. You may recall the story of the 10 lepers who were cured, but only one returned to give thanks to God. Which category do you fall into? We can never say thank you to God or to others enough.

I would suggest a couple concrete things this Thanksgiving. First of all, make a list of all the things for which you are grateful and place it somewhere where you can refer to it often, and add to it.

Also, you might consider a list of people to contact by phone, email, or letter this week to thank them for being a gift and blessing to you.

In a special way, you might reach out to health care providers and those considered "essential workers" who are putting their lives on the line for others. Continue to pray that a vaccine available for all will come soon.

Finally, thanks for your prayers, support, and participation in the life of our parishes.


