**Reflection** I looked back at last Easter's bulletin when I shared, I was in the kitchen drinking coffee, looking out the window on a bright and sunny Good Friday morning, pondering what my Easter message should be. I was aware that we would not be gathering for Holy Week services. On top of that, the forecast for Easter was cool and wet. It seemed a bit depressing when one looked at from that mindset.

We have been living in a crisis this year which has taken its toll in so many ways from lives to livelihood. The Easter story can enlighten our lives and diminish our fears. In this time of pandemic, a word which has become all too familiar is "sanitize"-we sanitize our hands and surroundings, which is a good and important thing to do. Sometimes in life we try to sanitize things in ways making them seem better or different. I think at times we can do that with the Easter story.

Put yourself there, considering the feelings of Jesus' mother, friends, and disciples. Not a good time for them-their hearts broken, fears looming, and uncertainties abounding. A burial where he is taken away without opportunity to grieve-a scene being played out so often this year, having experienced it first hand with my sister's covid related death a couple months ago.

Two days later, things would change with the angel's announcement to the women that Jesus had risen. Imagine their wonderment. In telling

the disciples there was not only curiosity but skepticism. Could what he had foretold been true—did it really happen?

As time moved on, they came to slowly discover the risen Jesus and how their lives would be transformed little by little. It took time but they were willing to engage him and follow. That brings me to my message.

We can become disheartened every time we hear the news. However, many broadcasters are ending with stories of hope. We know the outcome of the Easter story- Jesus is risen. He beat death!!!

When I feel disheartened, I can be renewed with the song "You Raised Me Up". You might take a moment to listen to it (🌐 <https://bit.ly/3dgnegP>).

My friends, in adversity we grow stronger when we unite ourselves more closely, individually and collectively, to Jesus the risen lord. Trying as this time of isolation may be, it is also time for firm resolve on how we will live life differently, more faithfully going forward.

One last thing would be to never take anything for granted anymore-our faith, the Eucharist, family, friends, and our very life. All are gifts from God-let us live in gratitude giving glory to God and sharing with one another.



**Mass Time Change** Beginning **Sunday, April 11** the Sunday evening Mass at the Cathedral will begin at 5:00 pm. This change still provides an opportunity for visitors while fitting better into our parish schedule and planning.

**Transition** Due to an unexpected pastoral need elsewhere in the Archdiocese, there has been some assignment shifts. Father Greg Bahl has been asked to serve as Administrator of St. Michael parish in Belle Plaine, St. Joseph parish in Chelsea, and St. Patrick parish in Tama, effective on 29 March 2021, until the new Pastor there assumes his duties, the timing of which is unsure at the present.

Last Monday, he moved to Tama to take over and to assist with needs there since their current pastor has been assigned elsewhere. He will remain in that role *the Director of the Office of Worship*.

Archbishop will be assisting Fr. Tom, along with other area priests during the interim.

**First Communion & Confirmation (04/29)** The Easter season is a time for celebrating the sacraments of initiation. Congratulations to Tom Bright (SR) who celebrated his Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. In the next couple weeks, children of our parishes will be celebrating First Eucharist at a mass of their choice.
