May 22-23, 2021 | Pentecost Sunday | Domingo de Pentecostés



**Reflection** Last week, we celebrated the Ascension, where Jesus took leave of his disciples, assuring them that the Spirit would lead them through their next step as his followers.

The word Pentecost is derived from the Greek word for 50 and originally referred to a feast celebrated 50 days after Passover. On the 50th day after the Resurrection, something new started to happen among them. Flames came to each member of the community, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit.

Luke's story could lead us to believe that the disciples went through an instantaneous transformation: receiving the Spirit, speaking in tongues, then preaching effectively to a multi-cultural crowd. Instead of a miraculous conversion, it took them 50 days of communal prayer to open their hearts and minds to what God was ready to do among them and in them.

The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of the community's slow opening to God's plan, and gradual acceptance of Paul and his welcoming Gentiles into the fold. It was not easy for the disciples to adjust to the fact that the Spirit works through each individual believer. Jesus had forewarned them that they had much to learn, but that they would only be able to bear it when they were guided by the Spirit of truth.

The Gospel of John depicts Jesus breathing the Spirit on the disciples on the evening of his resurrection. The mission he gives them is forgiveness. He warns them that if they do not make reconciliation available, it will not happen in their time.

Pentecost celebrates the grace-filled thriving of the human community through the indwelling of the Spirit. It reminds us that Jesus' promise to bestow his Spirit upon us can be limited only by our own unwillingness to continue his mission. The Acts of the Apostles assures us that the Spirit continues to work through frail, diverse, sometimes fighting, often feisty, human beings. The Spirit of God leads us to broaden our plans and go beyond our own narrow imaginations.

This 50th day of Easter reminds us that when we are willing, the Spirit takes our best plans and multiplies them over and again. *Fr. Tom*

## PASTOR'S UPDATE

Dear all, with the revised CDC recommendations (13 May 2021) and the lifting of mask mandates by the city and county, the protocols for worship and other parish activities have again been modified to correspond.

As previously communicated, Archbishop Jackels has lifted the dispensation to attend Mass on June 05-06, 2021, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi).

Facemasks are no longer required to be worn at liturgies by those who have been fully vaccinated. Those who have been fully vaccinated and wish to continue wearing facemasks as a precaution may continue to do so.

Those who have not been fully vaccinated (age 2 and above) are strongly recommended to continue wearing a facemask at liturgies.

The current seating pattern will continue with every other pew closed with seating in the open pews alternating between sitting in the middle or on the aisles, so all feel comfortable attending Mass.

As a continuing practice, worship aids will be included in the bulletin.

Holy water and baptismal fonts will remain empty—if you would like to have some holy water for home use, please bring a bottle and ask Father to bless.

Collection baskets (with poles) will resume at the 4:00 pm & 9:00 am Masses, while at the other Masses, baskets will continue to be placed at the entrances.

The Offertory procession with the presentation of the gifts of bread and wine will not resume immediately.

The Sign of Peace, which is an optional rite in the Mass, will continue to be omitted.

Holy Communion will continue to be distributed only under the species of bread with ministers continuing to come to you in the pews.

Receiving Communion in the hand will continue to be the norm for the safety of all.

Ministers will be masked while distributing, sanitizing before and after communion.

Live-streaming will continue for the Masses presently offered online.
