Psalm: 107

Reflection Today's Gospel is the first "nature miracle" in the Gospel of Mark. On one level, it is simply a story of Jesus rescuing his friends from danger. At the same time, every detail carries symbolic significance.

This boat trip began just after Jesus had taught through the parable of the farmer sowing the seed that the power of the Kingdom of God is sometimes hidden, and sometimes beyond our capacity to comprehend. After teaching, Jesus asked the disciples to cross the water, heading toward foreign territory, somewhat risky. Mentioning no real motive for the trip, Mark leads us to assume that what happened on the way surpassed any other purpose.

Water crossings can symbolize the twin experiences of trauma and transformation. In this case, while the disciples grew increasingly afraid of a raging storm, Jesus napped like a contented farmer who knows his seed is growing all by itself.

The combination of nature's wrath and Jesus' slumber was enough to undermine the disciples' confidence. They awakened him with the desperation, "Do you not care that we are perishing?"

Jesus responds to his disciples' cry by modeling the God who tamed the chaotic creation waters in Genesis and split the Red Sea as the Jews fled Egypt. Addressing the storm, Jesus commanded the turbulence to cease.

With the storm under control, Jesus focused on the disciples. Jesus so overwhelmed them that they turned to each other in terror, to ask, "Who is this?"

At this point in ordinary time that is precisely the question Mark wants us to ask. Like the disciples, we consider God with limited imagination and are often blind to anything bigger than our own plans and expectations. But God has fashioned us to be capable of more. Our human nature must open to the mysterious, sometimes overwhelming ways God is present to us.

As Paul said in the second reading: "If the love of Christ does not impel you, you have not yet met Christ." Let us ask God's help to open our eyes, mind, and heart to sense God's love and met Jesus Christ in ways we have yet to know. While risky, it can be rewarding. *Fr. Tom*






PARISH NEWS

St. Vincent de Paul In the Gospel today, Jesus calms the sea and then asks the disciples “Why are you lacking in faith?” In our life’s journey, we also must learn to believe in God’s presence and to trust in his care.

In May, through your gifts, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul was able to continue to show God’s love and care for others by assisting 26 families, providing \$900 in food, \$450 in gifts, and \$1,150 for utility and rent bills!
