**Reflection** The readings this weekend prompted me to think of advocacy, coming from Latin - “to call”. When we hear the word advocacy, we think of people who speak out for a cause, pleading for some action or response to improve the circumstances of the persons or situation.

In the gospel today there are two stories involving advocacy. In the first, the daughter of Jairus is very sick so Jairus approaches Jesus, calling out - advocating that he heal her. She was not able to do so herself, so her father spoke in her behalf. As we heard in the gospel, Jesus did heal her. It wasn't a quick instant healing but involved conversation, dialogue, and movement. These led to a deeper faith experience for all present.

The second story was the woman who had been sick for many years without receiving relief. In her situation she advocated for herself in a very persistent way, quietly approaching Jesus to touch his cloak. Realizing someone touched him, Jesus engaged her as she advocated for herself. The end result “Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction.”

At the end of their dialogue, Jesus summarized a theology of prayer in the three things he said to the woman: Your faith has saved you -- go in peace -- and be whole (cured). While some might approach prayer as if ordering from a menu, the purpose of prayer — be it petition, praise or penitence — is to bring us into an encounter with the God of life who desires the encounter more than we do.

Whether we begin by begging God for help for another or from our own need, the real point of the prayer is encounter with God — and all that results from that. Faith leads to action that generates greater faith.

This week, let us become advocates in two ways. Are there individuals or groups for whom we should advocate in prayer and action - the poor, the marginalized, the stranger, the forgotten?

Secondly, are there things in our own life which we need to advocate so we can be whole? Let us name our concerns and speak them to our Lord that he might touch our hearts as he did the young girl and elderly woman.





## PASTOR'S UPDATE

**Dear all,** our summer religious education camp concluded this past Friday. It was great to see our young people getting excited about their faith by not only learning the corporal works of mercy but how they can put them into action at their young age-it should prompt us to ask how are we as adults performing them!

If you are looking for an opportunity to serve others, consider connecting with the St. Vincent DePaul Society which is offering information sessions after the weekend Masses. Put your faith into action!

As the number of people attending Mass is increasing, we will remove designated seating signs on the weekend of July 4. We still encourage "giving people space", but not in the formal approach as we have done this last year. This is a good reminder to stay home if you are feeling ill, and to sanitize well. While covid has diminished, it is not over!

This will result in a return to the practice of the communion procession to receive Eucharist (in the form of bread only). Please allow some space between others when in line.

You may recall the ArchOne appeal which kicked off in 2019 but was suspended due to covid but will be continued in the future. In the next few weeks, you be hearing more about the replacement of the Cathedral parking lot which is one of the ArchOne projects. Future phases will include roof replacement and repairs inside, both of which will occur over the next couple years.

The parking lot project will begin in mid - July and take at least 3 months, all going well.

Workers will install a drainage system to eliminate flooding in the rectory and church basements during heavy rains, requiring replacement of the current hard surface. This will require alternate parking. More details on options will be given as the time approaches.

Finally next weekend, July 4, we celebrate Independence Day. I strongly encourage you to remember our country in prayer, that it be true to the principles of liberty and justice for all. Furthermore, let us pray for an end to acts of injustice and violence which inhibit freedom.






