

Reflection We could pick any moment in time and perceive as Jesus did: people are in need of good shepherds. How are we to determine who are the good shepherds? Today's psalm offers some guidance.

It begins, "The Lord is my shepherd." Immediately, it gives us some hints about how to recognize a good shepherd. Good shepherds lead us to green pastures and restful waters —These are places where people feel confident that God's world can provide generous plenty for everyone.

The psalm reminds us that the right path often takes us through dark valleys, but our divine shepherd remains with us, giving us the courage necessary to face evil. Halfway through our psalm, the image changes; the shepherd/lord becomes a servant or hostess.

Mark's gospel focuses on how Jesus' awareness of people's needs led him to respond as a Good Shepherd who would reveal God's generous plenty.

There is no doubt that one of our times' greatest needs is for healing the divisions that mark our church and world. Pope Francis warns us that, "Unless we recover the shared passion to create a community ... our energy and our resources ... will collapse and leave many in the grip of anguish and emptiness".

This week's Scriptures tell us that as followers of Christ the Good Shepherd, we must remember that the invitation to repose by restful waters is for refreshment, not permanent residence. We are invited to the banquet that nourishes us and called to spread the goodness and kindness we have learned.

Mark announces of the good news that could change the course of our lives. Mark invites us to look at our world the way Jesus looked at his: to feel the needs of our people and to respond in whatever way we are able.

Given the divided state of our church, country, and world, we cannot claim to be followers of the Good Shepherd unless we continue his work of tending the scattered flocks of which we are a part.

Like the psalmist, we are anointed to be messengers who open others' hearts and minds and eyes to see God's gracious plenty. *Fr. Tom*

ABOUT FR. MARTIN



A very serious illness helped Fr. Martin Coolidge to realize God was calling him to be a priest. Now that he is about to become a “doctor of souls,” he is filled with anticipation.

“The priesthood is a gift from God and I have much to learn as a new priest,” said the deacon as he reflected on his ordination. “I look forward to celebrating Mass and helping people in their relationship to God.”

Fr. Coolidge contracted a bad case of sepsis during his sophomore year in college. “I became very sick, near death,” the 29-year-old said. “It took me the better part of six months, almost a year, to recover.”

At the time he became ill, Fr. Coolidge had been attending Mass at St. Thomas Aquinas Parish and Catholic Student Center while studying meteorology at ISU. After getting well again, he began bringing the Eucharist to the sick.

“I was (treated) at that same hospital where I eventually went to visit people,” he said. “Father Jon (Seda) came, anointed me, gave me Communion. There was so much power, spiritual strength and an encounter with Christ there that it spiritually ... woke me up (and) renewed my life in Christ as a Catholic. When I did recover, God had kind of put that on my heart — this great thanksgiving for healing me, for renewing me spiritually. I felt like I could do this for other people. As a way to give thanks to God, I could bring them Communion, bring them prayer.”

Fr. Coolidge was born in Ft. Wayne, Indiana. He came to Iowa in 2010 to continue his education. His first assignment will be as associate pastor of the Cathedral of St. Raphael and St. Patrick parishes in Dubuque, with chaplaincy duties at Holy Family Catholic Schools.

As a priest, he hopes to benefit from the spiritual aid of St. Edith Stein (also known as St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross). “She always kept two things close to her heart that I desire as a priest: ‘Hail Cross, our only hope!’ and ‘Father, into your hands I commend my spirit’ (Lk 23:46),” explained Coolidge. “With this confidence, she gave her life for Jesus and the Church as one of the many Auschwitz martyrs since she was a Jewish convert to Catholicism. She was also an incredible intellectual, a prominent philosopher of her time. So, her intercession has helped me through my studies in seminary and will continue to do so as a priest seeking to always grow in knowledge of God!”




