## WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS & THE ELDERLY

Pray for Us*

**Reflection** Beginning this Sunday and continuing for the next four Sundays, we will be taking a wonderful journey into the sixth chapter of St. John's Gospel. We pause from reading the Gospel of Mark which we have been hearing on Sundays this liturgical year.

The focus of John 6 is Jesus the Bread of Life. How exciting! Just when summer reaches its climax without much festival or celebration (it's not Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter time), the Church in her wisdom provides us with a powerful and nourishing series of readings from Holy Scripture to grab our attention and shake us from some late summer spiritual doldrums.

The Bread of Life discourse in John 6 begins this Sunday with Jesus feeding the hungry 5,000 – the miracle of the multiplication of the five loaves and two fish. We will soon hear Jesus proclaiming himself the very bread of eternal life, the manna come down from heaven to feed us, and witness many of his disciples rejecting him because they find his teaching about eating his flesh and drinking his blood too difficult to believe.

The final Sunday of the Bread of Life Gospel readings ends with St. Peter confessing that Jesus has the words of eternal life and Jesus is the Holy One of God. So, get ready for the journey! How? Take some extra time these next four weeks to pray with John 6 on your own to personally encounter Jesus the Bread of Life. Break out your Bible and take just 15 minutes each weekend to read the Gospel passages again. This is a great way to pray. It will let the Gospel wash over you and sink into your heart.

By the end of our journey, we too can say with St. Peter: Yes, Jesus, I truly believe! You have the words of eternal life! You are the Bread of Life! This will inspire us to receive the Eucharist at Mass with greater love and devotion.

Our hearts will be more open to receive the love of Christ. Then, we will be transformed by Word and Sacrament to bring Jesus whom we have consumed out into the world because his love cannot be contained.

Help us Jesus – let it be so! *Fr. Martin*

## PASTOR'S UPDATE

It was great to see so many of you join us for our Summer Celebration last Thursday, to bid farewell to Fr. Greg, welcome Fr. Martin, and to thank Deacon Paul who has retired after years of faithful service. It was a summer fun opportunity of "re-gathering! It helped us to recall the value of community when gathered, something we have missed over the last year

Hopefully, the replacement project of the Cathedral parking lot which is the first of three ArchOne Special Appeal projects will begin this week. This will impact the garden areas near the Cathedral Center entrance which will be elevated to make the entrance to the passageway between the church and rectory accessible. Should anyone like any of the remaining plants in that area, feel free to harvest before work begins.

Workers will first install an underground drainage system to eliminate flooding in the rectory and church basements during heavy rains (not so much this year!), requiring the removal and replacement of the current hard surface.

This will eventually require alternate parking. We will try to keep you informed in the bulletin and on the webpage on the status of the project so you are aware of parking availability. In addition to on street parking, we have secured permission to park on Sundays in the Miracle Car Wash lot (except for marked rental spots), Artistic Cleaners, and the Dubuque Election Annex lot. There will be some inconvenience to us all, but the end result will eliminate flooding and stabilize of our facilities.

Future phases will include roof replacement and repairs inside, both of which will occur over the next couple years.

While a number of things have returned to "normal" not all. The news of a resurgence of the pandemic especially among the unvaccinated is cause for alarm. If not vaccinated and able to be, please consider doing so. Remember to stay home if you are feeling ill, and to sanitize well and often. While covid has diminished, it is not over!
