

**Reflection** When Jesus fixed his gaze on those who had chosen to journey with him, upon his inquiry of them, Peter responded, “You are the Christ.” Peter testified that he saw Jesus more than a prophet, but the anointed one sent by God to save Israel.

Jesus’ response was hard to swallow: “The Son of Man must suffer ... be killed, and rise after three days.”

Peter wanted Jesus to change that vision so he pulled Jesus aside to talk to him. Instead, Jesus confronted Peter saying, “Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do.” Thus, Jesus’ message to Peter (and us): “*You are to follow me, not the other way around!*”

Peter’s response is understandable. People suffering under Roman domination were not longing for a savior who would suffer. People who had waited for God to punish the wicked and reward the good couldn’t comprehend the idea that God’s chosen one could be put to death.

Much as we resist it, the God we meet in Jesus who is our savior, is unlike the materialistic, political or militaristic gods the world urges us to worship. The God we meet in Jesus does not squash evil, but takes it in. In Christ, God suffers evil to transform it. Jesus did not escape the cross, but revealed evil’s ultimate powerlessness to overcome with life and love.

The question Jesus put to the disciples remains relevant for us today. Who do we say Jesus is? Whose disciples are we? The gospel is clear. “Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it.”

Knowing that Jesus the Christ is the divine servant who does not avoid suffering, but transforms it, are we still ready to get behind Jesus, as he told Peter to do?

Where do we begin? The second reading from James is a great start. “What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?”

May our discipleship transform our lives, and be seen in our good works! Let your light shine. *Fr. Tom*





We are all called to evangelize and to share our faith with others. Hopefully we each value our Catholic faith and consider it something of great value to share with others. If you know someone who is interested in becoming Catholic or know someone who might be Catholic but not received First Communion and/or Confirmation, suggest that they join us on Sunday, October 10 at 8:00 am at St. Raphael Rectory to hear more about the Rite of Christian Initiations for Adults (RCIA). The archdiocese is collecting Mass attendance numbers for all weekend Masses in the month of September. These numbers will be compared to the previous "October Counts" to establish a baseline for pandemic re-engagement in the archdiocese. This might be a good time to ask yourself, what has been your own attendance pattern since March 2020 when a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass was given and continued to June 2021.

There are legitimate reasons why attendance might not be possible, but many have also shared that it became easy not to attend Mass, or to "watch" it in the comfort of one's home. This is a good time to evaluate if the rationale not to be present has merit.

This coming week begins Hispanic Heritage Month. We are blessed by our Hispanic brothers and sisters who worship with us, particularly at St. Patrick's. They have shared much with us and our communities are blessed. Through the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe, we seek God's blessings upon them.


