Reflection October is a great month for many reasons. To name just a few things: Leaves are changing beautiful colors, farmers are harvesting their crops, there is exciting post-season baseball to watch, it is Respect Life Month, and best of all it is a month dedicated to Mary! October is the month of the Holy Rosary. We celebrated Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7. This is not the memorial of Mary giving us the Rosary with her apparition to St. Dominic in 1214. It is the memorial of the Christian fleet defeating the invading Turkish navy in the Mediterranean Sea on October 7, 1571.

This miraculous victory came about through the powerful intercession of the Blessed Virgin. Hearing about the approaching invasion, Pope Pius V told people to pray the Rosary for the protection of Europe. Ship commanders ordered sailors to pray the Rosary before battle. The entire Christian fleet of many combined nations was led by an admiral from Spain who mounted a copy of the miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe on their main ship. The Archbishop of Mexico City had sent King Philip II of Spain this image to use in case Europe was threatened with invasion. That time had come, and the King of Spain gave the image to his Spanish Admiral to place the Christian fleet under the protection of Our Lady of Guadalupe who had appeared to Juan Diego in Mexico about fifty years earlier.

Vastly outnumbered, the Christian fleet was losing the battle and all seemed lost. Then the main ship's Admiral knelt in desperation and called upon Our Lady of Guadalupe to save them. Suddenly, a strong driving wind hit the Turkish fleet and put them into a panic. The Christian fleet then gained control of the battle and defeated the Turkish navy. Pope Pius V attributed the victory to the intercession of Mary through praying the Rosary. The lesser known but equally important fact is the divine assistance received through appealing to Our Lady of Guadalupe. Pope Pius V named October 7 the memorial of Our Lady of Victory, eventually renamed Our Lady of the Rosary.

This is a story of hope for all who are in desperate situations to pray the Rosary and another good reason to say: Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us! *Fr. Martin*
