**Reflection** Happy Sunday Feast of the Baptism of the Lord! Tomorrow, we begin Ordinary Time. This can seem like a downgrade from the joy of Christmas and the hope of a New Year, but the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord offers us a wonderful opportunity to recall our own baptisms as we begin Ordinary Time — a period of going deeper into our baptismal identity and the sacramental life of the Church (quite extraordinary!). Recalling your baptism does not mean that you must remember the water being poured over your forehead.

In recalling our baptisms, we ponder: What are its effects? How did baptism change you and me? The Catechism of the Catholic Church says: "Baptism is the birth into new life in Christ. In accordance with the Lord's will, it is necessary for salvation, as is the Church herself, which we enter though baptism" (CCC no. 1277). Baptism is a spiritual birth here and now to receive the hope of eternal life which comes through being united to the dying and rising of Jesus.

#### The effects of Baptism are:

- 1) Sins Forgiven: All sins are forgiven, especially Original Sin, to restore us to right relationship with God ("justified" by sanctifying grace), and temporal punishment due to sin is removed (the consequences of our sins). Our sins continue to be forgiven throughout life through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- 2) Adopted Children of God: We are given new permanent identities as sons and daughters of the Father and share in God's own divine life as living temples of the Holy Spirit. We receive the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit (wisdom, knowledge, understanding, counsel, piety, fear of the Lord, zeal for the Lord) and the three theological virtues (faith, hope, charity) to supernaturally help us.
- 3) Initiated into the Church: We become members of the Body of Christ, received into the living community of faith which is sustained by the sacraments and destined as pilgrims on earth for heaven.
- 4) Bonded to other Christians: We are spiritually connected to all Christians as brothers and sisters of the Lord Jesus.
- 5) Baptismal Character: We are once and for all sealed by the Trinity, claimed by God, and no longer slaves to sin and the fear of death but called to holiness and eternal life.

Thank you, Lord Jesus, for the gift of Baptism! Fr. Martin

# PASTOR'S UPDATE

**Dear all,** this weekend's celebration of Baptism of the Lord marks the end of the Christmas season. You will find further reflection on the feast on the front of the bulletin, but in brief, I hope that you have had a good Christmas season observance. It was good to see more people attending mass with some returning for the first time.

While winter began before Christmas, we didn't experience our first snow until after Christmas. With winter now upon us, it is good to offer a few reminders.

Please be mindful of public notices of travel advisories, be safe and encourage others as well. It is important to exercise caution when walking. We strive to keep sidewalks and lots clean, but bad weather doesn't follow our schedule. PLEASE exercise caution and lend a helping hand to anyone who may need a bit of assistance.

Please wipe your feet upon entering the church, to reduce cleaning needs. At the Cathedral, you likely noticed the use of sand instead of salt. With the new concrete, it is important that salt not be used in the first year, to allow the concrete to fully cure.

While making goals and resolutions are good, it is important to be patient with oneself and plan for attainable and sustainable goals, drawing upon the support and accountability of others.
