Dear Friends,

As you know, St. Jude, St. Joseph, and Annunciation BVM Parishes are Block III parishes in the one by One campaign. This campaign will have a positive impact on the lives of children, clergy, and families across the Diocese of Green Bay and allow all parishes, including ours, to address important local needs.

Our Parishes will benefit from one by One and have goals of \$350,000 (St. Jude); \$275,000 (St. Joseph); and \$250,000 (Annunciation).

Of this amount, 50 percent will remain at our respective parishes to meet locally identified needs:

St. Jude will use funds to replace our church air conditioning, enhance our worship space, and invest in our faith formation program.

St. Joseph will use funds to update our worship space, renovate the large hall, and create a parish growth and evangelization fund.

Annunciation will use funds to repair our church roof, establish a maintenance fund, and enhance our faith formation program. I look forward to the full participation of the parishes as we seek to further the mission of the church at our parish.

Greetings my friends! I hope this message finds you well. This weekend we find ourselves nearing the mid-point of Lent. I hope that your Lenten journey has been fruitful. For so many of us, this season provides us a very tangible and invaluable opportunity to take a good look at what we are doing to improve our lives through fasting, the lives of others through "almsgiving" or charity and, most importantly, our relationship with God particularly through prayer.
