A Lenten Journey with the Three Theological Virtues

Many of you know that I lost my brother John unexpectedly this year on January 31. When my sister Joan and I cleaned out his apartment and prepared to give away all his belongings, we had 7 or 8 boxes of spiritual books to give to the local parish. I kept the book John was presently reading "Interior Freedom" by Jacques Philippe. This book was found on a table near his chair.

Earlier John had told me about Jacques Philippe, a new author he had discovered. There were 8 other books by the same author on his shelf, waiting to be read, however, John never got to them. These books I brought to our convent in Green Bay after the cleaning venture. When I began my journey with John's book, I found he had highlighted and made notes in the margins. Some of the quotes he had shared on Facebook. Reading this book has served as part of my grieving for my brother, my Godson, who lost his life due to alcoholism. I want to share a section of this book with you today.

One section in Chapter 3 is about the three theological virtues: Faith, Hope and Charity. These three virtues, by which we are in union with our God, are foundational virtues from which all others flow. Virtue or virtus, the Latin derivative means strength or power. Let us look at each of these virtues. Jacques Philippe states that Faith is strength for us; Hope is confidence in God's faithfulness; Charity is the courage to love. Christians are people who believe in God, hope in God, and want to love God. Taking time for daily prayer and regularly celebrating the sacraments are a means of graces to increase these three virtues. Our life is growth in faith, hope and love.

The author goes on to compare these three virtues to the mysteries of the Rosary: Joyful, Sorrowful and Glorious. These mysteries are the cycle of our lives. Using St. Peter as an example, Jacques suggests that Peter's vocation or call to respond in faith was full of joy and happiness, thus the Joyful Mysteries. Peter's denial of Jeus and realizing his fall, yet seeing Jesus love him still, gave him hope of forgiveness and mercy - the Sorrowful Mysteries. Charity is the glorious outpouring of the Holy Spirit with the courage to love - Glorious Mysteries. "In heaven, faith will be replaced by sight, and hope by possession, only love will never pass away." Even on this earth our love is participating in our heavenly journey; and faith and hope help us do this. My brother John lived these virtues as faithfully as possible. John's faith, hope and love are brought to fulfillment because of God's unbounded love and mercy for him.




