

THE MOST IMPORTANT DAY IN HISTORY

The history of Easter Sunday is so important to Christians: it is the day we celebrate the single most important event in human history. If Jesus really did rise from the dead, then the things He said about God's kingdom coming to earth and inviting us to become a part of the new creation are all true.

Since then, spreading the news that Jesus is alive is the primary task of the church. Missionaries traveled far and wide throughout the world to share the fact that Jesus is alive and explain how God's kingdom is open to all people. We must become the donkey that Jesus rode on on Palm Sunday. We must carry Jesus into the world around us and introduce Him to people who do not know Him.

In order to spread this news more effectively, missionaries would communicate the history of Easter to people using their own cultural symbols. We can still see some of the artifacts of these cultural adaptations in the eggs and bunnies we see around Easter time. The message of Jesus' resurrection is just as relevant today as it was in 33 A.D. 
Easter People

Good To Know

Dear Parishioners,

If you or a family member is ever in the hospital, please know that you can call the parish directly to let us know. Often times we are unaware of parishioners who are in the hospital and a call to the Quad Parish office would help us in knowing this. Changes in regulations protecting patient confidentiality are in effect at all hospitals. Even when the hospital asks if they may notify us of your admission and you answer "yes", it is still helpful if you or a family member notifies us directly, especially if someone needs to receive the **Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.** Due to HIPPA regulations the hospitals are not able to notify us of a patient's condition, which is why your help in letting us know directly would be very helpful. You can also call the Pastoral Care Department at any hospital to notify us on your behalf.

Article 1421 in the Catechism of the Catholic Church states: The Lord Jesus Christ, physician of our souls and bodies, who forgave the sins of the paralytic and restored him to bodily health, has willed that his Church continue, in the power of the Holy Spirit, his work of healing and salvation, even among her own members. This is the purpose of the two sacraments of healing: the sacrament of Penance and the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.


