Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am approaching a transition in my ministry, and I am about to leave you. I want to thank all of you for the many ways you allowed me to serve you as parochial vicar for the Quad Parishes in Green Bay, WI. As the years go by, I will look back fondly on the two solid years spent with you.

Last March 25, I had the pleasure of celebrating my 48th sacerdotal anniversary. I wonder about the experience of serving people of different cultures, color and race. What passion did I have for Jesus to have gone this far? Many things were done, and many things had happened. I realized a few dreams, lived through a few trials and persevered.

I generally don't leave things unspoken. Whether it's something that fills me with joy or something that has been hurtful. It's not my natural inkling to let things quietly blow over. Words are my thing. So, it should come as no surprise that as I have recently made the decision to leave the quad-parishes, I cannot let this slip by without saying something. Though trained that the priests' life is a series of "hellos" and "goodbyes" yet leaving is no small matter. Breaking an interpersonal relationship is hard and heartbreaking, but it's time to say goodbye.

I remember the words from the book of Ecclesiastes: "For everything that happens in life-there is a season, a right time for everything under heaven: a time for keeping your

distance; a time to SEARCH, a time to GIVE UP AS LOST: a time to keep, a time to throw out: a time to tear apart, a time to bind together: a time to be quiet, a time to speak up; a time to love, a time to hate; a time to go to war, a time to make peace."

Leaving you, one remains constant: JESUS CHRIST. He has been here from the beginning and will be with you till the end of time. We have bonded and grown in wonderful ways while experiencing a great deal of mercy, grace, joy and love. We were blessed in many ways. I always believed that God is calling me to a particular place, for a particular time, with a particular purpose to a particular group of people and community.

Bye now and remember you will always be part of me. Thank you for all your patience, kindness, generosity and love. You are great people and I wish you all the best. May you continue to grow in faith, hope and love, worshiping the Lord with your whole heart, mind, body and soul. Remember, everything for the glory of God.

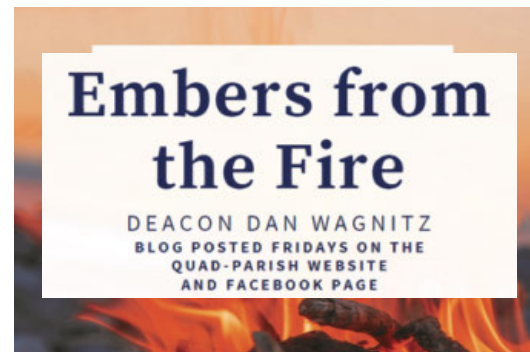
St. Patrick Church Door Update

Music educator organizes Ukraine benefit

MANITOWOC — When Stanislava Varshavski heard that Russia had begun invading her native Ukraine, she was in disbelief.

"I can't explain how I felt. I can say it was the shock of my life. The first three weeks, I couldn't eat, I couldn't sleep. I thought it was a nightmare," said Varshavski, director of music education for Holy Family Conservatory of Music in Manitowoc.

"I had relatives in Khar'kov (her birth city), and it was one of the first cities that got bombed. My former apartment building was hit with rockets two times," she said. As far as she knows, her friends and extended family are safe, but Varshavski remembers feeling helpless. "I didn't know what I should do," she said.

In March, the conservatory and the Manitowoc community worked together to gather medical supplies and donations for Ukraine. "I was so amazed by Americans, that so many people so many miles away

cared. I was really touched," Varshavski said.

Spurred by continuing news of the invasion, the conservatory decided to organize a benefit concert for Ukraine, set for 2 p.m. on Sunday, May 15. The concert will feature professional musicians and various genres of music. "We are musicians here. I think the best way to help is to play music," said Varshavski,

concert organizer. "It's about humanity. We need to fight evil and help people."

All money raised is designated for Catholic Relief Services for Ukrainian refugee supplies and housing, said Sr. Carol Ann Gambsky, administrator of Holy Family Conservatory of Music, in an email.

And expect changes, not just on the pages of The Compass, but on its website at thecompassnews.org, its e-newsletter and in its production schedule, as well as the entire Office of Communications for the Diocese of Green Bay.

With this issue, The Compass begins

the biweekly schedule it usually follows through summer and into September. However, because the Office of Communications of the Diocese of Green Bay is now in the process of restructuring, this will directly affect The Compass.

For the foreseeable future, the paper will continue to be printed on a biweekly basis. It will not return to weekly production in September.

will also continue — moving toward a biweekly schedule in September — as will many of the features readers have come to expect.
