




This is a three-phase program that begins with a weekend stay in the Wausau area. A series of "post sessions" provide ongoing healing and support. Presentations are given by couples who share their personal struggles in marriage and the tools they used to rediscover their love. Participants reflect and interact in privacy with their spouse. It is not group therapy. Costs are affordable and no couple is turned away because of limited finances. JANUARY IS NATIONAL SLAVERY & HUMAN TRAFFICKING PREVENTION MONTH Human trafficking can be described as a form of modern slavery, where victims, either male or female are forced into commercial sex and/or labor. Victims come from any socioeconomic group, race, culture, religion, ethnic background or age. Nobody appears to be immune or safe. However, this is an issue that many Americans are unaware of. Every day, people are coerced, deceived and forced into being trafficked, even by those close to them. Human trafficking and exploitation thrive on secrecy, and can only be ended through awareness. There are 25 different types of trafficking within the United States. Examples are: Sex trafficking, forced labor, forced marriage, exploitative begging and pornography. Many are targeted online. They are groomed and coerced. Identify the Emotional and Physical Signs of Trafficking:

Q Avoids eye contact Q Not trusting law enforcement

Q Appears to lie about their age Q Uses rehearsed lines and phrases Q Avoids answering questions Q Has tattoos with symbols Q Sexualized behavior Q Act fearful, submissive or timid Q Have no type of identification Q Inability to clarify where they are living or staying Q Exhibits self abuse such as cutting Q Has older friends with different lifestyles O Lack healthcare and/or are under nourished.
