Pastoral Reflections

Dear Parishioners,

Last week the Wisconsin Department of Health added clergy to the list of those eligible for the CoVid-19 vaccine. By the time you read this, I will have received my first dose. Our school and parish staff are also being offered the opportunity to be vaccinated through the Pacelli Catholic Schools. I want to take this opportunity to encourage everyone to consider being vaccinated when you are able to do so. As our US Bishops have stated, being vaccinated "can be an act of charity that serves the common good."

Some have questioned whether a Catholic can receive these vaccines because of their connection to the grave evil of abortion, either in their development or testing. This connection, while considered "remote" is still an issue for us as a people of life. Despite the legitimate ethical concerns surrounding the vaccines due to the use of compromised stem cell lines, both the Vatican and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have ruled that Catholics can in good conscience receive them when no "ethically irreproachable" vaccine is available. The statement from the Vatican is entitled, "Note on the morality of using some anti-CoVid-19 vaccines" and is available online. The statement from the US Bishops can be accessed here: www.usccb.org/resources/moral-considerations-regarding-new-covid-19-vaccines.

So, please rest assured, *it is not a sin to be vaccinated*. The Church earnestly requests pharmaceutical companies to refrain from using compromised stem cell lines in the development, production, and testing of vaccines and other therapeutics – and urges us to do the same. The Church also presumes that those Catholics receiving the vaccine are not in any way condoning abortion. While it is true that certain vaccines (Pfizer and Moderna) would be morally preferable to others (Johnson & Johnson) the reality is that most people will not have a choice of the vaccine available to them, especially in poor or rural areas. Consequently, *any of these vaccines may be licitly received where there is no alternative available*.

In all of this, we need to remember that central to our Catholic Faith is the reverence for all human life, from conception to natural death. This certainly means an unwavering opposition to abortion. But it also entails the same unwavering commitment to safeguarding human life and dignity in all other areas as well. To be credible in our witness to life we must also be consistent across the board. Doing our part to help bring the pandemic under control could certainly be considered a "pro-life" issue. It is so imperative, the Vatican statement insists, that if for reasons of conscience individuals opt not to be vaccinated, they "must do their utmost" to avoid the potential spread of the virus – wearing a mask, social distancing, avoiding large crowds, etc. It is simply part of loving your neighbor as yourself.



Everyday Stewardship - Recognize God in your ordinary moments When Our Own Hour Comes

We parents know that it's tricky, tackling the topic of fear with our kids. We want them to know that it's okay to be scared, that it's something we all feel from time to time. We want them to understand that bravery isn't the absence of fear, but the choices we make in persevering despite that feeling.

Most of all, we want to model the right kind of behavior for our kids. Whatever our scary situation is — illness, a job loss, life changes — we want them to see us make a choice to face that fear head-on.

Jesus seems to be the parent who is gently broaching the topic of fear with his children. A great sense of foreboding hangs over these readings. Jesus knew what was coming. He knew it was going to be hard, both for him and for his followers, who did not have his courage. Even he admits to being "troubled" and he speaks of "the time of judgment." There is the dramatic raising of Lazarus, the talk of how a grain of wheat must die in order to bear fruit, the depiction of Christ as an obedient student of his own suffering.

"Yet what should I say?" he asks them. "Father, save me from this hour?' But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour."



Spiritual Communion

Question:

What is spiritual communion, and do you need to be in a state of grace to receive it?

Answer:

The practice of making a "spiritual communion" dates back several centuries and St. Thomas Aguinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him." Traditionally, a prayer of spiritual communion has been used by those who are unable to receive sacramental communion because of health, inability to attend Mass, or who cannot receive communion because of grave sin. This practice has been encouraged by many saints and spiritual writers and most recently Pope Francis encouraged the practice when the realities of the COVID-19 pandemic prevented so many Catholics from taking part in the Mass or receiving sacramental communion.








DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004.

Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/ safeenvironment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.
