Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It seems that everyone in the Christmas story takes a journey. Mary goes in haste to visit Elizabeth. Later, she and Joseph travel to Bethlehem where Jesus Christ is born. Then they flee to Egypt to escape the murderous Herod. The



shepherds go in haste to the manger to see for themselves the newborn Savior. On Epiphany we celebrate the Magi who journeyed from distant lands by the guidance of a star. Everybody is on the move somewhere.

The Church also sees herself as a people on the move. Ever since our Lord commanded us to "Go and make disciples of all nations," we have been a missionary Church. We are also a Pilgrim People on a journey to the Promised Land of God's kingdom. The worst thing that could happen to the Church is that she ceases her pilgrimage; that she become content to stand still and become a kind of museum or a relic of the past. No, the Church is called to courageously go forward in faith in obedience to where the Holy Spirit is continually leading her.

Since the Second Vatican Council we Catholics have been recovering the process of journeying together. In church-speak we call such a process a "synod." That word "synod" literally means to walk together. This past October, Pope Francis opened a global synodal process for the whole Church. The Holy Father is inviting all of us to discern together where the Holy Spirit is leading us in our current age. We do this by sincere and respectful listening and dialogue in the context of prayer.

Our opportunity as a parish to participate in this world-wide synodal process will take place on Tuesday, January 25 at 6:30 pm. All are invited to join us that evening in the Mary Room for discussion of questions that have been prepared by the Vatican. The discussion questions will be made available ahead of time so that folks have the opportunity to pray and reflect prior to our meeting on January 25. There will also be opportunity to provide input online. Again, more information will be forthcoming.

As we celebrate Epiphany, we trust that God is guiding his Church by the light of the Holy Spirit, even as the Magi were led by the star. Like the Magi we are called to leave our safe and familiar spaces and make this journey together. Please join me in praying for our upcoming parish synodal process that it may truly be an occasion of grace for us, and for all our brothers and sisters in the Church.



Got Questions? Try ALPHA.....

What exactly is ALPHA?

Alpha is a multi-week course that creates a space where people come to discuss life's big questions. Everyone should have the chance to explore faith, ask questions, and share their story.

Alpha

What to expect:

First there is food....

Whether it's a group of friends gathered around a kitchen table, or a quick catch-up over coffee and cake, food has a way of bringing people together. It's no different at Alpha. We start with food, because it's a great way to encourage community and get to know each other.

Then a talk....

The talks are designed to engage and inspire conversation. Generally thirty minutes long, they can be given as a live talk or played as a video. They explore the big issues around faith and unpack the basics of Christianity, addressing questions such as *Who is Jesus?* and *How can we have faith?*

Followed by discussion....

Probably the most important part of any Alpha: the chance to share thoughts and ideas on the topic, and simply discuss it in a small group. There's no obligation to say anything. And there's nothing you can't say. It's an opportunity to hear from others and contribute your own perspective in an honest, friendly and open environment.

GIFT CARD PROGRAM

Did you know that the parish participates in the PCS Gift Card Program? How much will it really help? Do you purchase groceries and gasoline?

Purchase \$100 in Metro Market cards and a 4% profit helps the Parish.

Purchase \$100 in Kwik Trip cards and a 5% profit helps the Parish.

Commit to buying that every two weeks and the profit is \$9.00.

That totals to \$234 per year for purchases you made of groceries and gasoline.

Now what if 10 people purchased \$200 worth of these cards every two weeks?



That translates to	\$2,340 per year pr	ofit!
If 20 people would	commit\$4,680 per year p	rofit!
If 30 people would	commit\$7,020 per year p	rofit!
If 40 people would	commit\$9,360 per year p	rofit!
If 50 people would	commit\$11,700 per year p	rofit!

And don't stop with just gas and groceries, there are many other places that you may spend money that are in the gift card program. Stop by the information desk to pick up an order form. Then stop by the Parish Office, Monday through Friday, during regular office hours to purchase cards. You may want to call first, just to make sure we haven't sold out of the card you need (715-344-4326).



St. Elizabeth Ann Seton

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith.

When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.



After several years struggling

as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "Saint." ©LPi




