

## Gary Cumberland (School Principal)

The school for the most part has been face to face. Almost one year ago (March 13, 2020) all of the schools in the state of Wisconsin were shut down for the remainder of the school year. We were determined to bring our students back to school for this school year. The year started out a little rough and we had to go virtual for three weeks and two days in late September, because we had a few staff members test positive for COVID and no substitutes to cover classes. Once we returned from virtual learning in mid October we have been able to remain face to face. We believe that the many precautions we have put in place such as commercial air purifiers in each classroom, masking, social distancing, frequent hand washing, and a disinfectant misting machine has allowed us to continue to deliver face to face instruction. We are currently working on getting the vaccination for staff members who would like to receive it. We have received some financial support from the Federal government to help get the supplies we needed to help keep us face to face and the students and staff as safe as possible. Please continue to pray that we can continue to stay face to face and that we can soon return to some sort of normalcy for our students and staff.

One curricular item we are working on is to update our current science curriculum. The current curriculum is a number of years old and some of the science standards have changed since then. We need to keep up with those changes with a new curriculum. The teachers have heard a presentation that focuses more on the hands-on learning part of science. It also focuses on problem solving through experimentation and observation. We feel that this type of approach will allow us to develop more creative thinkers and allow us to more intentionally infuse our Catholic faith into the instruction. This is a decision that needs to be made by the end of April.

As we prepare for next school year, we need to start looking at projected student numbers for next school year. Autumnne Gee, our Director of Admission and Development has been working at trying to firm up these numbers. She has been doing some recruiting by taking parents on individual school tours, responding to telephone inquiries, and scheduling a modified open house for our potential 3 and 4 year old students and parents. Through her efforts this past school year we increased by 20 students and she believes we could increase by as much as 30 students for this coming school year. Besides class size, we reviewed tuition and made adjustments to account for some of the cost increases that we have been experiencing over the past few years.

This past year we needed to go through an accreditation process to keep our school accredited so that we can continue to receive CHOICE funding. This is on a six year cycle so every sixth year we need to demonstrate that we are a quality school, that we are reaching the needs of our students academically as well as spiritually. They typically have onsite visits but with the pandemic they needed to go through this process virtually this year. I am happy to say that the visiting team recommended that we receive accreditation without stipulations. I have been told that this type of recommendation is rare and that we should be proud of our accomplishments. The one characteristic of Sacred Heart Catholic School that stood out to the team was just how much we embraced our mission and loved our school. The following is that comment that they highlighted over and over in their report.

*“Overall, the Mission and Catholic Identity are being lived out in the school. During each interview with staff, there was a passion for the school and the mission to instill the Word of God in the students and challenge them to live the mission. Parents also expressed their desire for students to attend Sacred Heart because of the strong mission to develop children who know Jesus in all they do.”*

With that said I wanted to leave you with that mission that is being lived out each day here at Sacred Heart School and I want you to know just how proud I am to be a part of such a dedicated staff that works each day to see that we are living our mission. Thanks for all of your thoughts and prayers for our students and staff.

### Lenten Reminders

#### Lenten Regulations according to the U.S. Catholic Bishops

are to **abstain from meat** on **Ash Wednesday**, **all Fridays in Lent**, and **Good Friday**. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to **fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**. Those who are bound to this regulation may only eat one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

These minimal penitential practices should not be lightly excused.



## FOR SALE: Mission Mary Statues

Hello: Many of you may know already my passion for Foreign Mission work. I've been fortunate enough to go on the Green Bay Diocesan Deacon Missions to Elias Pina, Dominican Republic twice now. The Diocese has several Missions that head down there, two to build Chapels and several others for medical/dental care supported by the Diocese Parish members.

On my first trip down to Elias Pina, DR I noticed a lack of Spiritual artworks. Much of what they have are 2<sup>nd</sup> hand from the Green Bay area or simple unframed art works. When I returned home I looked into a Concrete mold for the Virgin Mary. I purchased one here to bring with me to Elias Pina. I poured eight statues to help fund the Mold project; took the Mary mold with me to Elias Pina and left the mold there. Since that time people have asked if I have statues or am making them. I have since gotten another Immaculate Heart of Mary mold and poured nine last summer of 2020.

I currently have six statues ready for immediate purchase. Four painted and two a nice white color. I will take orders and start pouring again around mid-May. The statues are 32" inches tall and weigh a solid 80 lbs.

These really turned out beautifully and withstand our WI weather. ALL proceeds will be used to fund any and all Mission work I will be doing in the future. All funds go towards the Mission as volunteers pay their own fees.

So now; how much? The Bright White Mary's are \$150 and asking \$200 for the hand painted Mary's.

## Shawano Area Matthew 25, Inc. (SAM25) update

Hello and thank you for your continued support and prayers for SAM25! We have been busy during the pandemic: We moved into our renovated new home at **105 E. Richmond Street** in mid October and opened SAM's House Emergency Shelter for its 6<sup>th</sup> shelter season. Thankfully, this bigger, more functional shelter space has thus far allowed for safe and healthy shelter and meals for the homeless, thanks be to God.

As of mid-February, SAM's House has provided 931 nights of stay and 2783 meals to 53 shelter guests (37 adults and 16 children). Our new SAM25 facility is also home to a day-time, year-round Resource Center offering assistance in job and housing applications, clothing, and hygiene supplies.

Soon to open is the **SAM25 Thrift Shop** which will provide affordable clothes to anyone in need. The Thrift Shop will also provide job training for shelter guests as well as funding for SAM25 programs. Renovations will soon begin for the SAM25 Community Free Clinic where medical care will be available from local volunteer providers to those in our area without health insurance. We are thankful to offer these services by the grace of God and the generosity of our community. **Here are some ways that you can help SAM25** continue to provide assistance to those struggling in our area: provide items on our website '**Needs List**' at [sam25.org](http://sam25.org), make a monetary donation, volunteer (masks are required by all) in the SAM25 office and Resource Center, Thrift Store, or shelter, make and deliver the evening meal for shelter guests (see sign-up link on website [sam25.org](http://sam25.org)), purchase a SAM25 mug, t-shirt, hoodie, or cookbook, and continuing to keep SAM25 and the people served in your prayers.
