

We have Children's Liturgy of the Word during the 10:00 am Sunday Mass. Children age preschool through 3rd grade can take part. Children are called forth for a blessing and then sent on their way to hear the Gospel message, discuss it, recite the creed and share prayer intentions. Next dates Feb 7th and 21st.

We are in our 3rd week in the study of 1 Corinthians... All are welcome to join us in this 10-week study. Reading ahead is helpful. We will cover chapters 3:5-4:21. The Corinthians were used to following human philosophers and joining the group who followed a particular philosopher's teaching. Paul is clear; he is not just another philosophical teacher, trying to get a following for himself. He is an Apostle of the one true God and baptism isn't in Paul's name but in the name of Jesus, who is God himself. Paul confronts the Corinthians' obsession with earthly wisdom and knowledge, and reminds them that it was not "wisdom," but rather "the power of the cross" that brought salvation and knowledge of God. Paul reminds them that the basis of their faith cannot be the wisdom of the world; rather their faith and their lives must be rooted in the cross of Jesus Christ. We meet on Thursdays at 9:00 am and 5:30 pm. Materials are provided. You can bring your own RSV version of the bible, if you like. We provide bibles for the study.



COVID-19 VACCINES

U.S. Bishops' Statement on Ethics of COVID-19 Vaccines There are currently three vaccines that are likely to be made available in the coming months, those from Pfizer, Moderna, and AstraZeneca. Neither Pfizer nor Moderna used morally compromised cell lines in producing the vaccine. A confirmatory test, however, employing the commonly used, but morally compromised HEK293 cell line (from kidney cells taken from an aborted child in the Netherlands in 1972) was performed on both vaccines. Thus, while neither vaccine is completely free from any connection to morally compromised cell lines, in this case the connection is very remote from the initial evil of the abortion. The AstraZeneca vaccine is more morally compromised. The HEK293 cell line was used in the design, development, and production stages of that vaccine, as well as for confirmatory testing. Where possible, then, the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are to be used instead. Where that is not possible or would mean significant delay, the AstraZeneca vaccine may be used, in the same way that the Rubella vaccine is used because there is no alternative. Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

There's a distinctive rumble in our Scripture readings this Sunday. Jonah marches through the city of Nineveh, and, before even making it a third of the way, news has spread so fast that the citizens immediately put on sackcloth and begin fasting. St. Paul, meanwhile, in the letter to the First Corinthians, has an urgency in his voice: "I tell you brothers and sisters, the time is running out." Jesus, similarly, tells us in the Gospel: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the Gospel." Urgent repentance is the theme.

The message of these readings might come as a bit of a shock to us. We have already finished Advent, and Lent is still several weeks away. We are in Ordinary Time, right? Why are we getting this message now? Well, traditionally, this particular Sunday was referred to as *Septuagesima Sunday*. It is exactly seventy days out from Easter. We are invited to begin preparations for the Lenten fast, today.

When it comes to Lent, often times our focus never rises above "what to give up," as if our Lenten practice, whatever it is, is the only key. Practices are important; what we do is important. But where these "doings" come from is more important. Jesus uses the word "repent" in our Gospel. In the original Greek this word, metanoéō, literally means to "change one's thinking." If there is anything that we need to be concerned with "doing," it is this. It is an inner transformation that Jesus is looking for, not a place in our schedules (if our Lenten plan is to read more Scripture, volunteer or pray more) or a place in our diet plan (if we plan on taking on fasting or giving up a favorite food) or a place in our bank accounts (if we plan on almsgiving). To prepare for Lent, we must identify, with the Holy Spirit, where in our lives, where in our thinking we need to be changed. Once we know that, the "doings" of Lent will become clear.
