PASTORAL THOUGHTS...

BEFORE I FORMED YOU IN THE WOMB I KNEW YOU."

We are now just a few months past the overturning of Roe', turning the direct killing of a child in the womb, back to each individual state. The Catholic Church has been in the forefront in their pro-life stance. For that stance the Church has seen brutal attacks on pro-life centers, vandalism and defacing of many Catholic Churches.
