

#### PASTORAL THOUGHTS...

## Did you know that Halloween's origins are rooted in Catholic theology?

Halloween is rooted in two Christian feasts; "All Saints' Day" on November 1<sup>st</sup> and "All Soul's Day" on November 2<sup>nd</sup>. The word **Halloween** is a contraction for those three words: All Hallows Eve. On All Hallows Eve, we are remembering these three holy days the evening before we are going to celebrate.

In the first several centuries of Christianity, the Roman Empire was persecuting and killing whole Christian communities. It is because of the first several centuries that we have come to know a lot of the great virtuous martyrs that died for their faith. Saints such as Perpetua and Felicity are two well-known martyrs. Unfortunately, there are also a lot of names that we don't know. As a way to remember them, the Church wanted to establish a feast day so that we could remember those brave men and women. We know that feast day to be All Saints Day. All Souls Day is to remember the souls of people who have passed in the past year or the recent past. These became very big feast days in the early Church that were originally celebrated in the spring.

Originally, Christians observed All Saints' Day on May 13. In the year 800, Pope Gregory III moved the feast day to November 1. It could be argued that one of the reasons Pope Gregory moved the feast day from May 13 to November 1 was due to the celebration called Samhain. Samhain was a festival celebrated by the ancient Celts that began on October 31 and lasted three days. Samhain was a celebration that marked the end of the Celtic year or "Summer's End." The Celts were not the only ones that celebrated the summer's end. By changing the date to November 1, the Church could assimilate the pagans into Christianity. Assimilating the pagan culture into Christianity, it was a way of showing that what they were celebrating is fulfilled in Christianity - Jesus Christ.

Where did getting treats on Halloween come from? Well during the celebration of Samhain there was a tradition of handing out soul cakes. Soul cakes are made of bread and sugar. The soul cakes were traditionally given to children and the poor who would go from door to door, begging for alms. So when they took the cakes they agreed to pray for the family members of those recently departed. In a way this was a double benefit because the poor were being fed and the prayers for the faithfully departed were being said. We get the tradition of handing out candy from the tradition of handing out soul cakes.

Special thanks to my Church History professors for passing along this wonderful knowledge of Halloween.
